21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

23	SECTION 1. (a) Upon retirement, any employee of any agency of the
24	State of Arkansas shall receive compensation for accumulated unused sick leave
- · 25	as follows:
26	(1) If the employee has accumulated at least fifty (50) days, but
27	less than sixty (60) days of sick leave, the employee shall receive an amount
28	equal to fifty percent (50%) of the number of accrued sick leave days (rounded
29	to the nearest day) times fifty percent (50%) of the employee's daily salary.
30	(2) If the employee has accumulated at least sixty (60) days, but
31	less than seventy (70) days of sick leave, the employee shall receive an
32	amount equal to sixty percent (60%) of the number of accrued sick leave days

35	(3) If the employee has accumulated at least seventy (70) days,

  - (e) In no event shall an employee receive an amount that exceeds seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) upon retirement due to the provisions of this Section.

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- (a) (1) State employees shall be entitled on March 1, 2001 to a lump sum payment of twenty dollars (\$20.00) per day for each day of
- 18 unused sick leave which was accrued during calendar year 2000. 19 (2) All state agencies subject to this act shall report to the 20 Office of Personnel Management no later than thirty (30) days after the
- effective date of this act, the average sick leave usage per employee for 22 calendar year 1998 and shall report to the Office of Personnel Management no
- 23 later than February 1, 2001, the average sick leave usage per employee for
- 24 calendar year 2000. The Office of Personnel Management shall calculate the
- 25 average sick leave usage per state employee during calendar year 2000 based on
- 26 the best available records and shall report the same and the percentage of

If the average sick leave usage did not decrease by at least twelve percent (12%) during calendar year 2000 as compared to calendar year 1998, the lump sum payment shall not be made for that year.

(b) Contributions of sick leave to an agency's catastrophic sick leave program shall not reduce the lump sum payment provided by this section.

SECTION 3. The provisions of this act apply to employees of the Game and Fish Commission, the Highway and Transportation Department, and all agencies of this state whether in the executive, legislative, or judicial branch of government except that this act does not apply to state-supported institutions of higher learning.

SECTION 4. <u>All state agencies are encouraged to participate in the Department of Finance and Administration state leave accounting system.</u>

SECTION 5. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 6. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 7. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly that the provisions of this act should become effective at the beginning of the next fiscal year; that unless this emergency clause is adopted, this act will not go into effect until after the beginning of the next fiscal year. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1,

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
