1	TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this act, the Chief Fiscal		
2	Officer of the State shall transfer on his books and those of the State		
3	Treasurer the sum of \$200,000 from the Remedial Action Trust Fund to the		
4	Abandoned Agricultural Pesticide and Plant Regulator Disposal Trust Fund to		
5	provide funds for the appropriation provided herein.

7	SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. <u>INTENT OF FUND. The General Assembly</u>		
8	intends to provide a method for disposal of agricultural pesticides which have		
9	been abandoned due to a change of ownership of the real property or a change		
10	in agricultural practices in a region of the state.

12	SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. <u>Definitions. As used in this act:</u>		
13	(1) "Abandoned" means chemicals which are no longer used and for which		
14	there is not planned use;		
15	(2) "Agricultural Pesticide" means any substance or mixture of substances		
16	intended for preventing, destroying, repelling or mitigating any pests; or any		
17	substance or mixture of substances intended for use as a plant regulator,		
18	defoliant or desiccant; and any substance or mixture of substances intended to		
19	be used as a spray adjuvant;		
20	(3) "Plant regulator" means any substance or mixture of substances intended		
21	through physiological action for accelerating or retarding the rate of growth		
22	or rate of maturation or for otherwise altering the behavior of plants or the		
23	produce thereof. The term shall not include substances to the extent that		
24	they are intended as plan nutrients, trace elements, nutritional chemicals,

27	SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. <u>FUND CREATED. There is hereby created on</u>		
28	the books of the State Treasurer, State Auditor and Chief Fiscal Officer of		
29	the State the "Abandoned Agricultural Pesticide and Plant Regulator Disposal		
30	Trust Fund" to consist of funds transferred therein from the Remedial Action

this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made 1 2 available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions 3 of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and 4 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 5 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 6 7 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 8

SECTION 7. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

20 SECTION 9. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with 21 this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the 23 24 Eighty-second General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that 25 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1999 is essential to the operation of 26 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 27 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 28 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1999 could work irreparable harm upon the 29 30 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 31 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 32 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1999. 33 34 /s/ Joint Budget Committee
