6 (3) The sum total of the pension to be paid the spouse or the 7 qualifying children of volunteer or part-paid fire fighters shall not exceed 8 one-half (1/2) of the salary attached to the rank the member held at the time 9 of his death as an active member of a volunteer or part-paid fire department, 10 nor shall it be less than thirty dollars (\$30.00) per month.

SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature

If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.
