29	SECTION 1. Arka	ansas Code Title 24, Chapter 5, Subcha	pter 2 is amended

SECTION 2. <u>The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement</u>
System shall present to the Joint Committee on Public Retirement and Social
Security Programs information concerning the statutory authority and actuarial
appropriateness of proposed board actions to establish or revise a multiplier,
any benefit, or a provision of a deferred retirement option plan.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 24-7-713 (b), as amended by Act 400 of 1999,
is amended to read as follows:

21 "(b)(1) Effective July 1, 1999, subject to the minimum financial 22 conditions set forth in § 24-7-718, retirees <u>and beneficiaries</u> shall receive 23 an increase in benefits of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month, 24 provided the board of trustees may elect and is granted authority to increase 25 the benefit to retirees in an amount determined by the board except such 26 benefit increase shall not exceed one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125) per 27 month.

(2) Members retiring after July 1, 1999 shall receive an
additional benefit of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month over and
above their regular annuity, provided the board of trustees may elect and is
granted authority to increase the additional benefit to members retiring in an
amount determined by the board except such additional benefit shall not exceed
one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125) per month.

34 (3) If an individual is also receiving benefits as a result of
 35 credited service under one (1) or more of the other reciprocal systems, as
 36 such systems enumerated in Arkansas Code 24-2-401, that individual shall

1	receive a prorated portion of the amount from the system.
2	(4) The prorated portion shall be determined by dividing the years
3	of credited service with the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System by the
4	member's or deceased member's total years of credited service with all
5	reciprocal systems provided the individual receiving such benefits shall
6	receive the additional amounts set out in subsection (b) of this section in

16	SECTION 4. No benefit enhancement provided for by this act shall be
17	implemented if it would cause the publicly supported retirement system's
18	unfunded actuarial accrued liabilities to exceed a thirty (30) year
19	amortization. No benefit enhancement provided for by this act shall be
20	implemented by any publicly supported system which has unfunded actuarial
21	accrued liabilities being amortized over a period exceeding thirty (30) years
22	until the unfunded actuarial accrued liability is reduced to a level less than
23	the standards prescribed by Arkansas Code, Title 24.

25	SECTION 5. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
26	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
27	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

29	SECTION 6. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
30	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
31	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
32	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this

35	SECTION 7. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are

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2	SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
3	Eighty-second General Assembly that the Teacher Retirement System has reduced
4	the amount of service credit needed for full retirement to twenty-eight (28)
5	years of credited service, that the Teacher Deferred Retirement Option Plan is
6	an important incentive to keep experienced teachers in the classroom rather
7	<u>than retiring completely, that experienced teachers are a valuable human</u>
8	resource and should be encouraged to stay in the classroom, and that the
9	beginning of the state's fiscal year is the best time to implement any change
10	in retirement benefits. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this
11	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
12	health and safety shall become effective on July 1, 1999.
