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26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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28	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-82-1002(5) pertaining to definitions is
29	amended to read as follows:
30	"(5) 'Tuition' means charges levied for attendance at an eligible
31	institution of higher education. For purposes of this subchapter, tuition
32	charges shall not include any fees charged or used for student activities,
33	including any student athletic fee- <u>;</u> "
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35	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 6-82-1002 pertaining to definitions is amended
36	by adding the following:

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1	"(6) 'Unemanicipated child (or children)' means a dependent child
2	(or children) as defined by the U. S. Department of Education for student aid
3	purposes."
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5	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 6-82-1004(e) pertaining to the Arkansas
6	Academic Challenge Scholarship Program is amended to read as follows:
7	"(e) The Department of Education and the Department of Higher Education
8	are directed to develop appropriate informational materials on the Arkansas
9	Academic Challenge Scholarship Program and ensure their distribution to
10	Arkansas students in grades kindergarten seven through twelve ($\frac{K7}{7}$ - 12) each
11	year as part of the packet of materials on precollegiate and technical
12	preparation distributed by the Department of Education as mandated by $\S-6-61-$
13	$\frac{111}{6}$ 6-61-217, 6-61-218, and 6-18-101(b)(2). This shall be accomplished
14	through the use of school counselors <u>or other appropriate school personnel</u> ."
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16	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 6-82-1005(b)(1)(A) pertaining to eligibility
17	for the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program is amended to read as
18	follows:
19	"(A) The recipient shall have graduated from an Arkansas
20	high school on or after March 5, 1991, and within twenty-four (24) twelve (12)
21	months of enrolling as a full-time first-time freshman at an approved
22	institution of higher education; and"
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24	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 6-82-1005(b)(1)(D) pertaining to eligibility
25	for the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program is amended to read as
26	follows:
27	"(D) The recipient must be accepted for admission at an
28	approved institution of higher education as a full-time first-time freshman,
29	as defined by the Department of Higher Education, and must enroll in an
30	approved institution within twenty-four (24) twelve (12) months of high school
31	graduation; and"
32	SECTION (Arkanaga Cada (02 100F(h)(1)(F) partaining to aligibility
33	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code 6-82-1005(b)(1)(E) pertaining to eligibility

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           SECTION 7. Arkansas Code 6-82-1005(b)(3) pertaining to eligibility for
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     the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program is amended to read as

     follows:
                 "(3) The student must demonstrate financial need as defined by
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     the Department of Higher Education. In calculating student financial need for
     applicants who graduate from an Arkansas high school after May 1, 1991 January
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     1, 1999, the following criteria shall be used:
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                       (A) An applicant whose family includes one (1)
     unemancipated child under the age of twenty-one (21) shall have average family
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     adjusted gross income over the previous two (2) years not exceeding thirty-
     five seventy thousand dollars ($35,000) ($70,000) per year at the time of
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     application to the program. If the applicant is an adopted child who was at
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     least twelve (12) years of age at the time of adoption, and the applicant's
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     family includes one (1) unemancipated adopted child under twenty-one (21)
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     years of age, the adoptive family's average adjusted gross income for the
     previous two (2) years shall not exceed forty thousand dollars ($40,000) per
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     year.
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                       (B) An applicant whose family includes two (2)
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     unemancipated children under the age of twenty-one (21) shall have average
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     family adjusted gross income over the previous two (2) years not exceeding
     forty seventy-five thousand dollars ($40,000) ($75,000) per year at the time
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     of application to the program. If the applicant is an adopted child who was at
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     least twelve (12) years of age at the time of adoption, and the applicant's
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     family includes two (2) unemancipated adopted children under twenty-one (21)
     years of age, the adoptive family's average adjusted gross income for the
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     previous two (2) years shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars ($50,000) per
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     vear.
                       (C) An applicant whose family includes three (3) or more
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     unemancipated children under the age of twenty-one (21) shall have average
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     family adjusted gross income over the previous two (2) years not exceeding
     forty-five eighty thousand dollars ($45,000) ($80,000) per year at the time of
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application to the program, plus, for families with more than three (3)

- unemancipated children under the age of twenty-one (21), an additional five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per year for each such additional child. If the applicant is an adopted child who was at least twelve (12) years of age at the time of adoption, and the applicant's family includes three (3) unemancipated adopted children under twenty-one (21) years of age, the adoptive family's average adjusted gross income for the previous two (2) years shall not exceed sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) per year, plus, for families with more than three (3) unemancipated adopted children under the age of twenty-one (21), an additional ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per year for each additional child.
 - (D) Any applicant whose family includes more than one (1) unemancipated child under the age of twenty-one (21) enrolled full time at an approved institution of higher education shall be entitled to an additional ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) of adjusted gross income <u>for each such additional child</u> when the Department of Higher Education calculates financial need.
 - (E) If the applicant is an adopted child who was at least twelve (12) years of age at the time of adoption and the applicant's family includes unemancipated adopted children who were at least twelve (12) years of age at the time of adoption, the adoptive family shall be entitled to an additional ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) of adjusted gross income per adopted unemancipated child."

- SECTION 8. Arkansas Code 6-82-1005(e) pertaining to eligibility for the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program is amended to read as follows:
- "(e) Students who meet the provisions of subdivisions (b)(1)(A)-(C), but who have not completed the core curriculum defined in subdivision (b)(1)(E) by the end of the senior year of high school, shall have the grace period of $\frac{1}{2}$ twelve (12) months, established for this purpose in subdivision (b)(1)(A) and (D), in which to make up any course or American College Test score deficiencies required for program eligibility."

- SECTION 9. Arkansas Code 6-82-1005(f) pertaining to eligibility for the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program is amended to read as follows:
- "(f) The State Board of Higher Education Arkansas Higher Education
 Coordinating Board shall have the authority to adjust these financial need
 family income requirements. Other financial need criteria necessary for the

selection of recipients, including those defined as emancipated or independent 1 2 by federal student aid regulations, shall be established through rules and 3 regulations issued by the Department of Higher Education." 4 5 SECTION 10. Arkansas Code 6-82-1006(b) and (c) pertaining to the duration and amount of scholarship is amended to read as follows: 6 7 "(b)(1) An eligible recipient shall receive a scholarship for one (1) 8 academic year, renewable for up to three (3) additional academic years if the 9 recipient meets continuing eligibility criteria established by the Department 10 of Higher Education. 11 (2) In addition to those continuing eligibility criteria 12 established through rules and regulations; the following criteria apply to 13 recipients who graduated from high school after December 31, 1998: 14 (A) Recipients entering the sophomore year who achieve a 15 cumulative grade point average of 3.0 3.25 or above in the freshman year shall 16 receive a scholarship award five hundred dollars (\$500) above the amount of 17 the annual scholarship received in their first year of eligibility. 18 (B) Recipients entering the junior year who achieve a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 3.25 or above shall receive a 19 20 scholarship award five hundred dollars (\$500) above the amount received in the 21 sophomore year. 22 Recipients entering the senior year who achieve a 23 cumulative grade point average of 3.0 3.25 or above shall receive a 24 scholarship award five hundred dollars (\$500) above the amount received in the 25 junior year. 26 (3) In addition to those continuing eligibility 27 criteria established through rules and regulations, the following criteria 28 apply to recipients who graduated from high school before December 31, 1998: 29 (A) Recipients entering the sophomore year who 30 graduated from high school before December 31, 1998, and who earned a 31 cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above in the freshman year shall 32 receive a scholarship award five hundred dollars (\$500) above the amount of 33 the annual scholarship received in their first year of eligibility. 34 (B) Recipients entering the junior year who graduated from 35 high school before December 31, 1998, and who earned a cumulative grade point

average of 3.0 or above shall receive a scholarship award five hundred dollars

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1 (\$500) above the amount received in the sophomore year. 2 (C) Recipients entering the senior year who graduated from 3 high school before December 31, 1998, and who earned a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above shall <u>receive a scholarship award five hundred dollars</u> 4 (\$500) above the amount received in the junior year. 5 (c)(1) The amount of the annual scholarship awarded to each recipient 6 7 shall be the lesser of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) or the annual tuition charged by the approved institution in which the recipient is 8 9 enrolled. For recipients who graduated from high school prior to January 1, 10 1995, the amount of the annual scholarship awarded to each recipient shall be the lesser of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or the annual tuition charged by 11 12 the approved institution in which the recipient is enrolled. 13 (2) For new recipients who enroll in college as first-time 14 entering freshmen after July 1, 1997, the amount of the annual scholarship 15 awarded to each recipient shall be the lesser of two thousand five hundred 16 dollars (\$2,500) or the annual tuition charged by the approved institution in which the recipient is enrolled. For recipients who graduated from high school 17 between January 1, 1995, and December 31, 1996, the amount of the annual 18 19 scholarship awarded to each recipient shall be the lesser of one thousand five 20 hundred dollars (\$1,500) or the annual tuition charged by the approved institution in which the recipient is enrolled. 21 22 (3) For recipients who graduated from high school between January 1, 1997, and December 31, 1998, the amount of the annual scholarship awarded 23 24 to each recipient shall be the lesser of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or the annual tuition charged by the approved institution in which 25 the recipient is enrolled. 26 (4) For new recipients who graduated from high school after 27 28 December 31, 1998, the amount of the annual scholarship awarded to each 29 recipient shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500). 30 (3)(5) Tuition shall mean the charges defined in § 6-82-1002(5)." 31 SECTION 11. Arkansas Code 6-82-1001 pertaining to legislative findings 32 33 and declarations of public necessity is amended to read as follows: "6-82-1001. Legislative findings and declarations of public necessity." 34

The General Assembly hereby recognizes that taking the proper coursework

- 1 students who complete the recommended precollegiate or technical preparation
- 2 core curriculum score significantly higher on standardized preadmissions tests
- 3 and are more likely to be successful in college. Because the State of
- 4 Arkansas also benefits from the academic success of well-prepared college
- 5 students, there is hereby established the Arkansas Academic Challenge
- 6 Scholarship Program, a guaranteed_college scholarship plan to promote academic
- 7 achievement and encourage academically prepared Arkansas high school graduates
- 8 to enroll in the state's colleges and universities."

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- SECTION 12. Arkansas Code 6-82-1004 pertaining to the authority of the Department of Higher Education is amended to add a new subsection to read as follows:
- "(g) The Department of Higher Education is authorized to determine the necessary procedures for the awarding of scholarships should the number of eligible applicants exceed the funds available."

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- SECTION 13. 6-82-1006(d) pertaining to the duration and amount of scholarship is amended to read as follows:
- scholarship is amended to read as follows:

 "(d) The amount of the annual scholarship awarded to each recipient

shall not be less than that provided for in subsection (c) of this section.

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SECTION 14. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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SECTION 15. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

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2	SECTION 16. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
3	hereby repealed.
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5	SECTION 17. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the
6	Eighty-Second General Assembly that in order to provide adequate scholarships
7	and financial assistance to Arkansas high school students graduating in 1999
8	that it is necessary to amend the eligibility requirements of the academic
9	challenge scholarship program; that a delay in the effective date of this act
10	could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration of the scholarship
11	program and high school students graduating in 1999. Therefore, an emergency
12	is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
13	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on
14	the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor
15	vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the
16	period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is
17	vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective
18	on the date the last house overrides the veto.
