8	SECTION 3. (a) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of			
9	State, Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a special			
10	revenue fund account to be known as the "School Repair and Renovation Fund."			
11	(b) All moneys collected under this act shall be deposited to the			
12	credit of that account as special revenues and shall be used by the Department			
13	of Education for grants to public school districts for making repairs to			
14	school facilities or to renovate school facilities.			
15	(c) Grants to public school districts from the School Repair and			
16	Renovation Fund shall be awarded based on need. The State Board of Education			
17	shall establish grant criteria by regulation.

35	SECTION 8 EMERGENCY CLAUSE It is hereby found and determined by the			

Eighty-second General Assembly that many school buildings are in need of

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1	immediate repair; that a number of the school districts do not have sufficient
2	resources to adequately address the problem; and that state assistance is
3	necessary to help school districts make repairs and renovations. Therefore,
4	an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for
5	the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective
6	<u>on July 1, 1999.</u>
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
