"AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 2001; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

Subtitle

"AN ACT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH APPROPRIATION FOR THE 1999-2001 BIENNIUM."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES -OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for the Department of Health for the 1999-2001 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

4 contractual personnel who must be employed in order to provide services in the
5 home. These payments will be made from the appropriation for Professional Fees
6 and Services.

7

8 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
10 SALARIES. The Department of Health is hereby authorized to pay from State or
11 Federal funds appropriated herein, extra salaries in addition to the maximum
12 annual amount provided in the Regular Salaries Section of this Act for a
13 maximum of twenty (20) medical doctors who are certified by the American
14 Specialty Boards, but not to exceed \$4,500 per medical doctor for each fiscal
15 year. The Director of the Department of Health shall also be eligible for
16 extra salaries as established herein.

14 Visit pay shall not exceed \$45 per visit. Employees requested to be on-
15 call and/or on standby for visiting on nights, weekends, and/or holidays will
16 be eligible to receive on-call pay not to exceed \$30 per day. Provided
17 however, no compensation shall be paid to any employee required to be on-call
18 and/or standby who fails to respond after the second notification that their
19 services are needed. In the event of equipment or paging device malfunction,
20 such penalty shall not apply. All compensated services shall be provided as
21 directed by the Department of Health. All visit and on-call pay shall be paid
22 from funds from In-Home Services Extra Salaries as appropriated in this Act.
23 Such compensation for visit and on-call pay, when added to the employee's

7 FACILITY SERVICES CARRY FORWARD. Subject to the approval of the Chief Fiscal

SECTION 51. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the Arkansas Department of Health, Bureau of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention for the Community Alcohol Safety Program for the 1999-2001 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

SECTION 52. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY FORWARD. Any balance remaining in the appropriation and funds made available for the State Alcohol Program which remains on June 30, 1999 or June 30, 2000 or both may be carried forward into the next fiscal year, there to be used for the same purpose.

SECTION 53. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OUTSTANDING ENCUMBRANCES. All outstanding encumbrances of the Community Alcohol Safety Program as of June 30, 1999, shall be paid by the Arkansas Department of Health with Community Alcohol Safety Program funds.

SECTION 54. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PERSONNEL

1 TRANSFER. All personnel transferred from the Arkansas State Highway and
2 Transportation Department pursuant to Section 50 of this Act shall be eligible
3 for employment under this Act in a comparable position with the Arkansas
4 Department of Health, Bureau of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention.

6 SECTION 55. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE
7 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARKING FEES. On
8 July 1 of each year the Department of Health shall pay from the state

32 SECTION 58. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
33 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
34 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

36 SECTION 59. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act or the application

1 thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall
2 not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given
3 effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
4 provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

5
6 SECTION 60. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with
7 this act are hereby repealed.

8
9 SECTION 61. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
10 Eighty-second General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
11 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
12 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1999 is essential to the operation of
13 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
14 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
15 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1999 could work irreparable harm upon the
16 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
17 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
18 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
19 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1999.
