1 (2) The district has suffered damage to its physical facilities 2 in an amount exceeding one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) as 3 a result of fire or other natural disaster and the board of directors has 4 determined that the proceeds of insurance on those facilities will be 5 insufficient to restore or replace the facilities; or
