1 Medical Sciences will be eligible to receive incentive pay not to exceed 1.2 2 times their base hourly rate. Employees required to be available for duty on 3 nights, weekends and holidays will be eligible to receive standby pay equivalent of up to four hours of work per shift. Employees required to work 4 in specialty areas will be eligible to receive up to ten (10) percent of the 5 hourly rate paid as a specialty differential while working in such areas. 6 7 When overtime, shift differentials, standby pay, incentive pay and/or specialty differential are provided to employees as herein described, the 8 9 total may exceed the line item maximum salaries for those positions as included in this Act. The positions of Patient Care Administrator, Associate 10 Administrator, and Assistant Administrator of Patient Care as authorized in 11 12 Section 1 of this Act shall be excluded from coverage of this Section. ١n 13 addition, the Board of Trustees may also make special compensation allowances 14 available, in such amounts as the Board may determine or justify equitable in 15 view of the current requirements for Registered Nurses in the Clinical 16 Programs of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the availability of Registered Nurses for employment in the Little Rock 17 18 metropolitan area. However, under no condition shall the special allowances 19 approved by the Board of Trustees for a single individual exceed the state 20 line item maximum by more than 20% for those positions included in this Act. 21

22 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DAY CARE. 24 Of the funds appropriated in Section 6 of this Act, \$250,000 each year of the 25 biennium may be allocated as the State's portion of the operating cost of a 26 Child Care Facility of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. 27 Individuals using this facility will be charged a daily rate as determined by 28 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

29

30 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY 32 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of the general revenue appropriations and 33 funds provided by this Act which remains at the close of the fiscal year 34 ending June 30, <del>1998</del> <u>2000</u>, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of funded 35 appropriations, shall be carried forward and made available for the same 36 purpose for the fiscal year ending June 30, <del>1999</del> <u>2001</u>.

Any unexpended balance of cash fund appropriations provided by this Act which remains at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, <u>1998</u> <u>2000</u>, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of funded appropriations, shall be carried forward and made available as contingency for the fiscal year ending June 30, <u>1999</u> 2001.

SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ADMISSION POLICY. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall admit one 25 26 hundred fifty (150) freshman students in each year of the 1997-99 1999-2001 biennium into the College of Medicine. Provided that no funds shall be 27 28 expended to fund the positions of Chancellor, Dean of Medicine and any 29 academic position until the Chancellor and Dean of Medicine certify to the 30 Arkansas Legislative Council that the provision of this Section relating to 31 the 1997-99 1999-2001 biennium requirement for one hundred fifty (150) 32 freshman student admissions has been implemented.

34 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHAPLAIN
 36 HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical

Sciences may designate up to forty-five per cent (45%) of the regular gross salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-404(11).

SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. INDIGENT 9 CARE REIMBURSEMENT. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is hereby 10 11 authorized to utilize funds appropriated by this Act to extend provisions of 12 Act 688 of 1989 to authorize procedures for the disbursement of Indigent Care 13 maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid from cash funds of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction of reporting, as 14 15 provided by Section 1 of Arkansas Code 19-4-1609.

17 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 19 PROVISIONS FOR ON-CALL STATUS AND STAND-BY PAY FOR CERTAIN CLASSIFIED 20 EMPLOYEES WORKING IN CRITICAL AREAS. All classified positions employed in 21 areas providing critical and emergency support of the clinical and physical 22 operations of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and required to 23 work outside their normal work schedule shall be eligible for on-call status 24 and to receive stand-by pay not to exceed four hours of work per shift. When standby pay is provided to employees as herein described, the total 25 26 compensation may exceed the line item maximum salaries for those positions as included in this Act. 27

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29 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 30 31 ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher Education shall establish and maintain for the 1997-99 1999-2001 biennium a 32 33 pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level not to exceed \$102,504 per year. These positions are to be used by the University of 34 35 Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs of the University during the 1997-99 1999-2001 biennium exceed the number of 36

positions allocated to the University by the Legislature. The University 1 2 shall provide justification to the Arkansas Department of Higher Education for 3 the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific positions are requested by 4 the University, approved by the University Board or their designee, and 5 reviewed approved by the Legislative Council. Furthermore, the Office of 6 7 Personnel Management (OPM) of the Division of Management Services of the Department of Finance and Administration shall establish and maintain for the 8 9 1997-99 1999-2001 biennium a pool of three hundred (300) classified positions at up to a grade 26. These positions are to be used by the University of 10 11 Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs of 12 the University during the 1997-99 1999-2001 biennium exceed the number of 13 positions in a classification allocated to the University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification to OPM for the need to allocate 14 15 titles from this "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific positions are requested by the University, 16 recommended by OPM, and reviewed approved by the Legislative Council. 17 18 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is 19 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by 20 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly 21 22 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be 23 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution. 24 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the institution 25 broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and 26 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of 27 28 the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the 29 30 Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section. If the 31 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void. 32 33 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 35 COURSE

36 REQUIREMENTS. The provisions of Arkansas Code 6-61-105 and 6-61-106 shall not

apply to students selected to be admitted to the University of Arkansas School
 of Medicine or the University of Arkansas School of Pharmacy.

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SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 5 CHI LD HEALTH AND FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute 6 7 shall be administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or 8 9 contract with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences - Department of Pediatrics for services required in delivering the programs of the Child 10 Health and Family Life Institute. The KIDS FIRST Program, a component of the 11 12 Child Health and Family Life Institute, shall receive priority consideration 13 above all other programs of the Institute when funding decisions are made by Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas Children's Hospital shall make 14 15 quarterly reports to the Arkansas Legislative Council on matters of funding, 16 existing programs and any new programs and/or services offered through the Child Health and Family Life Institute. 17

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19 The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall 20 designate an individual from the Department of Pediatrics who shall provide 21 administrative oversight of the cooperative agreements and/or contracts with 22 Arkansas Children's Hospital in delivering the programs of the Child Health 23 and Family Life Institute. Arkansas Code</u> 32 <u>Annotated 19-11-203(14)(Z) is hereby amended to read as follows:</u> "(Z) <u>Medical</u> 33 items used for the treatment and diagnosis of patients if <u>Commodities and</u> 34 <u>services for use in research, education and treatment for the diagnosis, cure</u> 35 <u>and prevention of disease may, with administrative approval, be</u> procured 36 through a group purchasing entity serving other public health institutions

when substantial savings are available. On 10 11 July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall pay 12 from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue, the total 13 amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission. 14 15 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE 16 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 17 18 PROVISIONS. Disbursement of funds authorized 4 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 5 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary 6 7 Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or 8 9 their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and 10 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in 11 12 disbursement of said funds. 13 14 SECTION 33.
