20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
21

22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for  
23 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 1999-2001 biennium,  
24 the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be  
25 governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act  
26 (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory  
27 thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum  
28 annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the  
29 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons  
30 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of  
31 the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-  
32 101), or its successor.

 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. STIPENDS.  
 9 The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is hereby authorized to pay  
 10 stipends to students engaged in post-graduate clinical training in accredited  
 11 programs of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, from "Regular  
 12 Salaries" or "Maintenance and General Operation", as follows:

 23 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ADMISSION  
 25 POLICY. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall admit one  
 26 hundred fifty (150) freshman students in each year of the ~~1997-99~~ 1999-2001  
 27 biennium into the College of Medicine. Provided that no funds shall be  
 28 expended to fund the positions of Chancellor, Dean of Medicine and any  
 29 academic position until the Chancellor and Dean of Medicine certify to the  
 30 Arkansas Legislative Council that the provision of this Section relating to  
 31 the ~~1997-99~~ 1999-2001 biennium requirement for one hundred fifty (150)  
 32 freshman student admissions has been implemented.

33  
 34 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHAPLAIN  
 36 HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical

1 Sciences may designate up to forty-five per cent (45%) of the regular gross  
2 salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or  
3 appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used  
4 by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the  
5 Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-  
6 404(11).

7  
8 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. INDIGENT  
10 CARE REIMBURSEMENT. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is hereby  
11 authorized to utilize funds appropriated by this Act to extend provisions of  
12 Act 688 of 1989 to authorize procedures for the disbursement of Indigent Care  
13 maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid from cash funds  
14 of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction of reporting, as  
15 provided by Section 1 of Arkansas Code 19-4-1609.

16  
17 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL  
19 PROVISIONS FOR ON-CALL STATUS AND STAND-BY PAY FOR CERTAIN CLASSIFIED  
20 EMPLOYEES WORKING IN CRITICAL AREAS. All classified positions employed in  
21 areas providing critical and emergency support of the clinical and physical  
22 operations of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and required to  
23 work outside their normal work schedule shall be eligible for on-call status  
24 and to receive stand-by pay not to exceed four hours of work per shift. When  
25 standby pay is provided to employees as herein described, the total  
26 compensation may exceed the line item maximum salaries for those positions as  
27 included in this Act.

28  
29 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
31 ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher  
32 Education shall establish and maintain for the ~~1997-99~~ 1999-2001 biennium a  
33 pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level not to  
34 exceed \$102,504 per year. These positions are to be used by the University of  
35 Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs of  
36 the University during the ~~1997-99~~ 1999-2001 biennium exceed the number of

1 positions allocated to the University by the Legislature. The University  
 2 shall provide justification to the Arkansas Department of Higher Education for  
 3 the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No classifications will  
 4 be assigned to the pool until such time as specific positions are requested by  
 5 the University, approved by the University Board or their designee, and  
 6 ~~reviewed~~ approved by the Legislative Council. Furthermore, the Office of  
 7 Personnel Management (OPM) of the Division of Management Services of the  
 8 Department of Finance and Administration shall establish and maintain for the  
 9 ~~1997-99~~ 1999-2001 biennium a pool of three hundred (300) classified positions  
 10 at up to a grade 26. These positions are to be used by the University of  
 11 Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs of  
 12 the University during the ~~1997-99~~ 1999-2001 biennium exceed the number of  
 13 positions in a classification allocated to the University by the Legislature.  
 14 The University shall provide justification to OPM for the need to allocate  
 15 titles from this "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the  
 16 pool until such time as specific positions are requested by the University,  
 17 recommended by OPM, and ~~reviewed~~ approved by the Legislative Council.

18 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is  
 19 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by  
 20 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and  
 21 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly  
 22 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be  
 23 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.  
 24 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in subsection  
 25 (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the institution  
 26 broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and  
 27 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of  
 28 the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council in the  
 29 utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the  
 30 Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section. If the  
 31 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled unconstitutional  
 32 by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

33

34 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COURSE  
 36 REQUIREMENTS. The provisions of Arkansas Code 6-61-105 and 6-61-106 shall not



1 apply to students selected to be admitted to the University of Arkansas School  
2 of Medicine or the University of Arkansas School of Pharmacy.

3  
4 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHILD  
6 HEALTH AND FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute  
7 shall be administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital.  
8 Arkansas Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or  
9 contract with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences - Department of  
10 Pediatrics for services required in delivering the programs of the Child  
11 Health and Family Life Institute. The KIDS FIRST Program, a component of the  
12 Child Health and Family Life Institute, shall receive priority consideration  
13 above all other programs of the Institute when funding decisions are made by  
14 Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas Children's Hospital shall make  
15 quarterly reports to the Arkansas Legislative Council on matters of funding,  
16 existing programs and any new programs and/or services offered through the  
17 Child Health and Family Life Institute.

18  
19 The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall  
20 designate an individual from the Department of Pediatrics who shall provide  
21 administrative oversight of the cooperative agreements and/or contracts with  
22 Arkansas Children's Hospital in delivering the programs of the Child Health  
23 and Family Life Institute. The designated administrator from the University  
24 of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics shall make quarterly  
25 reports to the Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences  
26 and the Arkansas Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing  
27 programs and services offered through the Child Health and Family Life  
28 Institute. Further, the Department of Pediatrics shall make every effort to  
29 advance the KIDS FIRST Program statewide.

30  
31 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. PURCHASING DEFINITIONS. Arkansas Code  
32 Annotated 19-11-203(14)(Z) is hereby amended to read as follows: "(Z) Medical  
33 items used for the treatment and diagnosis of patients if Commodities and  
34 services for use in research, education and treatment for the diagnosis, cure  
35 and prevention of disease may, with administrative approval, be procured  
36 through a group purchasing entity serving other public health institutions

1 when substantial savings are available. A report shall be filed annually with  
 2 the Division of Legislative Audit reflecting the justification of and the  
 3 estimated savings accruing due to the use of this exemption;"

4  
 5 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. MOTOR VEHICLE AUTHORIZATION. Arkansas Code  
 6 19-4-906(a)(119) is hereby amended to read as follows:

7 "(119) Univ. of Ark. for Medical Sciences 34 60"

8  
 9 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE  
 10 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARKING FEES. On  
 11 July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall pay  
 12 from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue, the total  
 13 amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking Services from  
 14 Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

15  
 16 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE  
 17 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER  
 18 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship  
 19 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and  
 20 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing  
 21 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such  
 22 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for  
 23 "Medical Loans and Scholarships".

24  
 25 SECTION 31. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated,  
 26 to the University of Arkansas, to be payable from cash funds as defined by  
 27 Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the University of Arkansas, for personal services  
 28 and operating expenses of the University of Arkansas - Various Divisions which  
 29 shall be supplemental and in addition to the appropriation made in Section 6  
 30 of Act 431 of 1999, for the biennial period ending June 30, 2001, the  
 31 following:

3 SECTION 32. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized  
4 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds  
5 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the  
6 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary  
7 Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures  
8 and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or  
9 their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where  
10 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and  
11 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in  
12 disbursement of said funds.

13

14 SECTION 33. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
15 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
16 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
17 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
18 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
19 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
20 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint  
21 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

22

23 SECTION 34. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent  
24 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas  
25 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

26

27 SECTION 35. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act or the application  
28 thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall  
29 not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given  
30 effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the  
31 provisions of this act are declared to be severable except as provided in  
32 Section 24 of this Act.

33

34 SECTION 36. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with  
35 this act are hereby repealed.

36

1           SECTION 37. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the  
 2 Eighty-second General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas  
 3 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that  
 4 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1999 is essential to the operation of  
 5 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
 6 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
 7 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1999 could work irreparable harm upon the  
 8 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
 9 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
 10 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
 11 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1999.
