19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20	
21	SECTION 1. Definitions. As used in this act:
22	<u>"Personal watercraft" shall mean a vessel, less than sixteen (16) feet,</u>
23	propelled by a water-jet pump or other machinery as its primary source of
24	motor propulsion which is designed to be operated by a person sitting,
25	<u>standing or kneeling on, rather than being operated by a person sitting or</u>
26	<u>standing inside the vessel.</u>
27	
28	SECTION 2. <u>Regulation of personal watercraft</u> .
29	<u>(a) No person shall operate a personal watercraft unless each person</u>
30	aboard is wearing a type I, type II, type III, or type V personal flotation
31	device approved by the United States Coast Guard, provided no person aboard a
32	personal watercraft shall use an inflatable personal flotation device to meet
33	the personal flotation device requirement of this subsection.
34	(b) A person operating a personal watercraft equipped by the
35	manufacturer with a lanyard type engine cutoff switch shall attach such
36	lanyard to his person, clothing, or personal flotation device as appropriate

1	for the specific vessel.
2	(c) No person shall operate a personal watercraft at any time between
3	thirty (30) minutes after sunset and thirty (30) minutes before sunrise.
4	<u>(d) No person under fourteen (14) years of age shall operate a personal</u>

1	SECTION 3. <u>Exemptions.</u>
2	(a) The provisions of Section 2 shall not apply to a person
3	participating in an officially sanctioned regatta, race, marine parade,
4	tournament, or exhibition.
5	(b) Law enforcement officers and emergency response personnel engaged
6	in the performance of their duties shall be exempt from the provisions of this
7	<u>act.</u>
8	(c) The provisions of subsection (a) of section 5 of this act shall not
9	apply to the State of Arkansas, including state agencies, boards and
10	commissions, nor its political subdivisions such as counties and
11	municipalities; however the remaining provisions of this act, including

19	<u>(b) No person shall operate a personal watercraft towing another person</u>
20	on water-skis or other device unless the total number of persons operating,
21	observing, and being towed does not exceed the specified number of passengers
22	as identified by the manufacturer as the maximum safe load for the vessel.
23	
24	SECTION 5. <u>Regulation of personal watercraft liveries.</u>
25	(a) A personal watercraft livery shall carry liability insurance in an
26	amount of not less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000).
27	<u>(b) Operators of rental personal watercraft shall be required by livery</u>
28	operators to view a personal watercraft instructional video approved by the
29	Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission Boating Safety Office.
30	(c) A personal watercraft livery shall provide for the operator of
31	rental personal watercraft in print, prior to rental, the boating regulations
32	peculiar to the area of rental, including, but not limited to, no-entry zones,
33	no-wake zones, channel routes and water hazards, and tidal flow (where
34	applicable).
35	(d) A personal watercraft livery shall provide the operators of rental
36	personal watercraft with all equipment required under state law.

1	<u>(e) A personal watercraft livery may not enter into a lease for rental</u>
2	agreement for a personal watercraft with any person under eighteen (18) years
3	of age.
4	
5	SECTION 6. The provisions of this act shall be supplemental and in
6	addition to any other laws and regulations relating to boats or other
7	watercraft.
8	
9	SECTION 7. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
10	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
11	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
12	
13	SECTION 8. <u>Penalties. Each violation of this act shall be punishable</u>
14	<u>by a fine not less that fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than one hundred</u>
15	<u>dollars (\$100) except that the fine for violating subsection (e) of section 2</u>
16	shall be no less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than two hundred and
17	<u>fifty dollars (\$250).</u>
18	
19	SECTION 9. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
20	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
21	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
22	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
23	act are declared to be severable.
24	
25	SECTION 10. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
26	hereby repealed.
