All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 30 31 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 32 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 33 SECTION 10. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 34 35 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 36
