20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
21

22 SECTION 1. *Arkansas Code 5-37-101(9) is amended to read as follows:*

23 "*(9) 'Written instrument' means any paper, document, or other material*
24 *containing written or printed matter or its equivalent and shall include any*
25 *money, token, stamp, seal, badge, trademark, retail sales receipt, Universal*
26 *Product Code Label or other evidence or symbol of value, right, privilege, or*
27 *identification which is capable of being used to the advantage or disadvantage*
28 *of any person."*
29

30 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
31 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
32 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
33

34 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
35 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
36 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without

1 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
2 act are declared to be severable.
