6	functions and that this act should be given effect immediately to assure that
7	the board can be selected and can begin carrying out its responsibilities as
8	soon as is practical. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this
9	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
10	health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the
11	Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it
12	shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which
13	the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the
14	veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house
15	overrides the veto.
