2	<u>monitoring of earthquake activity in Arkansas in order to provide reliable</u>		
3	data for a realistic seismic hazard assessment and it is the intent of this

6	SECTION 2. The University of Arkansas at Little Rock is hereby directed		
7	to establish the Arkansas Seismological Observatory as a part of the Arkansas		
8	Center for Earthquake Education and Technology Transfer. The Arkansas		
9	Seismological Observatory shall:		
10	(1) Monitor earthquake activity throughout the state;		
11	(2) Assist in emergency planning and in providing early warning;		
12	(3) Provide public education regarding earthquake hazards;		
13	(4) Provide information useful for earthquake hazard mitigation;		
14	(5) Provide the scientific community with relevant data;		
15	(6) Provide real time, immediate data regarding seismic activity to

18	as Arkansas Nuclear One, the National Center for Toxicological Research, and

24	SECTION 3. The seismic network operated by the Arkansas Seismological		
25	Observatory should initially consist of at least ten (10) stations installed		
26	at remote locations with the central recording station located on the campus		
27	of the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. The complete monitoring network		
28	should be established over a five (5) year period to allow for technological		
29	upgrades so that state-of-the-art seismological equipment will be utilized		
30	appropriately throughout the network.		
31			
32	SECTION 4. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature		
33	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code		
34	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.		
35			
36	SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to		

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1	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
2	other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without
3	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
4	Act are declared to be severable.
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6	SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are
7	hereby repealed.
