(3) After the election official reads aloud from the statement, 8 the election officials shall compare name, address, date of birth, and 9 signature of the voter's absentee application and voter's statement. If the 10 application and the voter statement *does* not compare as to name, address, date 11 12 of birth and signature, the application, absentee ballot envelope and 13 statement shall be placed in an envelope marked 'challenged.' The election official shall record the reason for the challenge on the envelope and it 14 15 shall be referred to the County Board of Election Commissioners. The County 16 Board of Election Commissioners shall determine if the voter is qualified and 17 whether or not the vote shall be counted.

18 (3)(4) If no challenge is made and the statement is in proper
19 form, the election official shall, without opening the inner envelope
20 containing the ballot, remove the inner envelope and place it in the ballot
21 box without marking it in any way. Proper form shall include the voter's

24 box designated for them and retained as are other ballot stub ends;

25 (5)(6) After all of the outer envelopes have been opened and a 26 list has been made in duplicate of the name and voting precinct of the voters, 27 as required herein, the election officials of the absentee box shall preserve 28 all the statements of voters and deliver them to the county clerk who shall 29 file and keep them for the same length of time after the election as required 30 for retention of other ballots, and the statements shall be made available for 31 public inspection during regular business hours;

32 (6)(7) When all of the inner envelopes containing the ballots 33 have been placed in the ballot box and the ballot stub ends have been 34 deposited in a separate box, the ballot box shall be shaken thoroughly so as 35 to mix the ballots;

4	SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature		
5	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code		
6	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

9	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect		
10	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without		
11	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this		
12	act are declared to be severable.
