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19	SECTION 1. <u>(a)</u>	It is the intent of the General Assemb	oly to provide a
20	fair and equitable method, consistent with the Arkansas Constitution, for		
21	assessing inventory of merchants. The General Assembly recognizes the issues		
22	unique to merchants involving the acquisition and maintenance of inventory		
23	until such inventory is sold at a profit. The General Assembly further		
24	recognizes that the A	Assessment Coordination Department utili	zes more than one
25	method to value and a	assess merchants' inventory. The purpos	se of this act is
26	to create a statute s	specifically identifying as appropriate,	fair and
27	constitutional, an as	ssessment method utilized by the Assessm	nent Coordination
28	Department. It is no	ot the purpose of this act to limit the	valuation or
29	assessment methods ut	tilized by the Assessment Coordination D	<u>)epartment.</u>
30	(b) The asses	ssment method to be utilized by the Asse	essment

33	voluntary assessment by merchants identifying the average monthly sales of

2	personal property) and 26-26-1203(b) (time period of valuation for merchants).		
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4	SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature		
5	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code		
6	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.		
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8	SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to		
9	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect		
10	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without		
11	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this		
12	act are declared to be severable.		
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14	SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are		
15	hereby repealed.		
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17	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the		
18	Eighty-second General Assembly that merchants' inventory is unique in regard		
19	to the procedure for assessment for personal property taxes and that this act		
20	is necessary to provide a fair method of assessing such inventories.		
21	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately		
22	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall		
23	become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is		
24	neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the		
25	expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill.		
26	If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall		
27	become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
