3	SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to		
4	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect		
5	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without		
6	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this		
7	act are declared to be severable.		
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9	SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are		
10	hereby repeal ed.		
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12	SECTION 5. <u>EMERGENCY CLAUSE</u> . It is hereby found and determined by the		
13	<u>Eighty-second General Assembly that the law concerning the waste tire grant</u>		
14	program is inadequate for the protection of the public. Regional solid waste		
15	management districts are dependent on adequate grant funding which this bill		
16	would provide. Without adequate funding, the districts' efforts to manage		
17	waste tires, which can result in a blight on the countryside and hazardous and		
18	unhealthy conditions, would be hindered. Therefore, an emergency is declared		
19	to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the		
20	public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its		
21	approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the		
22	Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time		
23	during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the		
24	Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the		
25	last house overrides the veto.		
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
