For An Act To Be Entitled

9 "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE PLANT BOARD TO SAMPLE
10 AND ANALYZE GRAIN AND SEED DISTRIBUTED IN ARKANSAS AND
11 TO ESTABLISH AFLATOXIN LEVELS PERMISSIBLE IN SUCH
12 GRAIN AND SEED; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

14 "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE MAXIMUM
15 AFLATOXIN LEVEL PERMISSIBLE IN GRAIN AND
16 SEED DISTRIBUTED IN ARKANSAS."

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
21

22 SECTION 1. The level of aflatoxin in Arkansas grown grain and seed sold
23 or distributed in this state shall be monitored by the State Plant Board.
24

25 SECTION 2. Methods of sampling and analysis of the grain and seed
26 described in section 1 shall meet the standards prescribed by the Grain
27 Inspection, Packers and Stockyards Administration (GIPSA) of the United States
28 Department of Agriculture (USDA).
29

30 SECTION 3. The State Plant Board is hereby authorized to establish
31 rules and regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this act.
32

33 SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
34 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
35 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 5. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
