25	(a) There is established an advisory	committee, to be known as the	
26	"Individual Sewage Disposal Systems Advisory Committee", for the purpose of		
27	making recommendations, advising, and providing assistance to the <del>Program</del>		
28	Administrator of the Environmental Program Section of the Division of		
29	Environmental Health Protection of the Department of Health concerning the		
30	utilization and application of alternate and experimental individual sewage		
31	disposal systems.		
32	(b) The advisory committee shall consist of twelve (12) members, to be		
33	appointed as follows:		
34	(1) A member of the Arkansas Ho	me Builders Association, to be	
35	appointed by the president of the associati	appointed by the president of the association;	
36	(2) A member of the Arkansas Re	al Estate Commission, to be	

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1 appointed by a majority vote of the commission;

two (2) or more counties in this state;

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- 2 (3) A member of the Arkansas Realtors Association, to be appointed 3 by the president of the association;
  - (4) One (1) member who shall be a currently serving or former member of the board of a suburban improvement district or an officer or member of an association of property owners created by and pursuant to state law and organized for the purpose of maintaining common facilities, including sewage disposal facilities, in unincorporated subdivisions in this state, to be named by the Governor. However, in making the appointment, the Governor shall name a person who has been a developer or a member or officer of the board of a development company that has developed large unincorporated subdivisions in

- 16 (6) Two (2) licensed Soil Classifiers, to be named by the 17 Governor;

  20 the four (4) congressional districts to ensure statewide representation;
- 21 <u>(8) A soils professor from an accredited college or university to</u> 22 be selected by the Governor;

- 25 (7)(9) The Program Administrator of the Environmental Program
  26 Section, Division of Environmental Health Protection, Department of Health;
  27 and
- 28 (8) (10) One (1) field sanitarian, specialist or sanitarian
  29 supervisor to be named by the The Director of the Division of Environmental
  30 Health Protection, Department of Health;
- 31 (9) The Director of the Arkansas Department of Pollution Control 32 and Ecology or his designee;
- 33 (10) The State Conservationist of the United States Department of 34 Agriculture Soil Conservation Service, or his designee; and
- 35 (11) The State Geologist with the Arkansas Geological Commission 36 or his designee.

- (c)(1) The six (6) members of the advisory committee appointed to serve thereon in the manner set forth in subdivisions (b)(1) through (b) $\frac{(5)}{(7)}$  of this section shall be appointed for terms of four (4) years.
- (2) A vacancy in the term of any member due to death, resignation, or other cause shall be filled in the manner provided in this section for the original appointment for the unexpired portion of the term.
- (d) Members of the advisory committee shall serve without pay but may receive expense reimbursement in accordance with 25-16-901 et seq.
- (e)(1) The advisory committee shall elect from its membership a chairman, a vice\_chairman, and a secretary\_treasurer, who shall each serve a term of one (1) year. Officers shall be eligible for election to succeed themselves; however, the officers shall be limited to two (2) consecutive terms.
  - (2) The committee shall establish its own rules of procedure.
- (3) The committee shall meet <u>quarterly each calendar year</u>; the <u>time</u>, <u>place</u>, and <u>location</u> of the <u>quarterly meetings shall</u> be scheduled and <u>approved by a consensus of the committee</u>. A <u>special meeting may be called upon call</u> by the chairman, <u>or</u> at the request of any five (5) members of the committee stated in writing, <u>or</u> at the request of the Director of the Division of Environmental Health Protection of the Department of Health, or <u>upon call</u> by the Director of the Department of Health."

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 14-229-102 is amended to read as follows: "Individual Sewage Disposal Systems Advisory Committee-powers and duties.

The Individual Sewage Disposal Systems Advisory Committee shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) To advise with and make recommendations to the Director of the Department of Health and the Director of the Division of Environmental Health Protection Sanitarian Services of the Department of Health, concerning the utilization and application of alternate and experimental individual sewage disposal systems;
- (2) To advise with and assist the Division of <u>Environmental Health</u>

  <u>Protection Sanitarian Services</u> in efforts to promote the experimentation, development, and improvement of individual sewage disposal systems;
  - (3) The committee shall advise and assist the State Board of Health in

adopting rules and regulations and interpreting regulations pertaining to individual sewage disposal systems; and

- (34) To advise with and assist the Division of Environmental Health Protection Sanitarian Services in the development and implementation of:
- (A) Training and educational programs for employees of the Division of Environmental Health Protection Sanitarian Services, to acquaint the employees with technological advances in the development of experimental and alternate systems for individual sewage disposal systems;
- (B) Opportunities for employees of the Division of Environmental Health Protection Sanitarian Services and designated representatives to participate in seminars and other training programs designed for their technological advancement, including the promulgation of guidelines and regulations for reimbursement of expenses for employees and doctors who engage in the training and education opportunities;
- (C) The acquisition of laboratory testing equipment necessary for the conducting of experiments and testing of experimental and alternate individual sewage disposal systems;
- (D) The acquisition of necessary field supplies and equipment to enable the Division of Environmental Health Protection Sanitarian Services to engage in necessary field activities to assist property owners in the installation, operation, and repair of experimental and alternate individual sewage disposal systems, and to enable the department to offer technical advice, when requested by property owners, with respect to the operation or repair of the equipment;
- (E) To provide, if funds are available therefor, technical assistance, materials, and equipment required for the modification or repair of experimental and alternate individual sewage disposal systems, which have been installed by property owners under permits issued by the department, of equipment approved by the department as being adequate to meet state individual sewage disposal systems standards; and
- (F) To cooperate with and offer assistance to other public agencies, private developers, and home owners in the development, installation, operation, repair, modification, and improvement of experimental and alternate individual sewage disposal systems for the purpose of developing the necessary technological advancements required to meet the standards prescribed by the Division of <a href="Environmental Health Protection Sanitarian">Environmental Health Protection Sanitarian</a>

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5	SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature	
6	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code	
7	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.	
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9	SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to	
10	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect	
11	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without	
12	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this	
13	act are declared to be severable.	
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15	SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are	
16	hereby repealed.	
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
