- "Section 2. Legislative Branch.
- 3 (a) The Arkansas House of Representatives shall consist of members to be 4 chosen every second year by the qualified electors of the several counties.
- 5 No member of the Arkansas House of Representatives may serve more than three
- 6 six (6) such two year terms. A member of the Arkansas House of
- 7 Representatives who is in office on November 7, 2000 shall only be eligible to
- 8 serve three (3) such two (2) year terms including any terms served prior to

- SECTION 2. Section 6 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas is amended to read as follows:
- 22 "Section 6. Qualifications of judges of Supreme Court.

A judge of the Supreme Court shall be at least thirty years of age, of good moral character, and learned in the law; a citizen of the United States and two years a resident of the State, and who has been a practicing lawyer eight years, or whose service upon the bench of any court of record, when added to the time he may have practiced law, shall be equal to eight years. The judges of the Supreme Court shall be elected by the qualified electors of the State and shall hold their offices during the term of eight four years from the date of their commissions; but at the first meeting of the court after the first election under this Constitution the judges shall by lot divide themselves into three classes, one of which shall hold his office for four, one for six and the other for eight years, after which each judge shall be elected for a full term of eight years. A record shall be made in the court of this classification. After the general election in the year 2000, the

judges shall by lot divide themselves into two (2) classes, two (2) of which

shall hold office for two (2) years and three (3) of which shall hold terms of four (4) years, after which each judge shall be elected for a full term of

3 <u>four (4) years</u>."

SECTION 3. Section 19 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas is amended to read as follows:

"Section 19. Circuit clerks - Election - Term of office - Ex-officio duties - County clerks elected in certain counties.

The clerks of the circuit courts shall be elected by the qualified electors of the several counties for the term of two four years, and shall be ex-officio clerks of the county and probate courts and recorder; provided, that in any county having a population exceeding fifteen thousand inhabitants, as shown by the last Federal census, there shall be elected a county clerk, in like manner as the clerk of the circuit court, and in such case the county clerk shall be ex-officio clerk of the probate court of such county until otherwise provided by the General Assembly."

SECTION 4. Section 24 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas is amended to read as follows:

"Section 24. Prosecuting attorneys.

The qualified electors of each circuit shall elect a prosecuting attorney, who shall hold his office for the term of two four years, and he shall be a citizen of the United States, learned in the law, and a resident of the circuit for which he may be elected."

 SECTION 5. Section 29 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas is amended to read as follows:

"Section 29. County judge - Election - Term - Qualifications.

The judge of the county court shall be elected by the qualified electors of the county for the term of two four years. He shall be at least twenty-five years of age, a citizen of the United States, a man of upright character, of good business education and a resident of the State for two years before his election, and a resident of the county at the time of his election and during his continuance in office."

SECTION 6. Section 46 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of
