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3 4 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 6-82-503 is amended to read as follows: "6-82-503. Entitlement.

(a) If any Arkansas law enforcement officer, or full-time or volunteer 5 fireman, or state highway employee, state correction employee, state parks 6 7 employee, teacher, or state forestry employee suffers fatal injuries or wounds or becomes permanently and totally disabled as a result of injuries or wounds 8 9 which occurred in the performance of a hazardous duty within the scope of his employment or which occurred en route to a location where a hazardous 10 11 situation existed, his children and spouse shall be entitled to an eight-12 semester, or the equivalent thereof, scholarship without cost, exclusive of 13 books, food, school supplies, materials, and dues or fees for extracurricular activities, at any state-supported college or university of his choice within 14 15 this state.

(b) Scholarship benefits shall not accrue under this subchapter to any
person if the wounds or injuries suffered by any law enforcement officer,
fireman, or state highway employee, state correction employee, state parks
<u>employee, teacher, or state forestry employee</u> are self-inflicted or whose
death is self-induced.

21 (c) The Arkansas State Claims Commission shall, unless § 6-82-504(e) is 22 applicable, award any scholarship benefit provided by the provisions of this 23 subchapter at the same time any death benefit or total and permanent 24 disability benefit is awarded by the Claims Commission under the provisions of 25 § 21-5-701, et seq. <u>Title 21</u>, Chapter 5, Subchapter 7 of the Arkansas Code."

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27 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 6-82-504 is amended to read as follows:
28 "6-82-504. Awards to children.

29 (a) In order for a natural child to be eligible to receive a30 scholarship benefit:

31 (1) The child must have been born prior to the date of the death
32 or total and permanent disability of the law enforcement officer, municipal
33 fireman, or state highway employee, state correction employee, state parks
34 employee, teacher, or state forestry employee; or

35 (2) The law enforcement officer, municipal fireman, or state
36 highway employee, state correction employee, state parks employee, teacher, or

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state forestry employee or the spouse of the law enforcement officer, 1 2 municipal fireman, or state highway employee, state correction employee, state 3 parks employee, teacher, or state forestry employee must have been pregnant 4 with the child at the time of the death or total and permanent disability of the law enforcement officer, municipal fireman, or state highway employee, 5 state correction employee, state parks employee, teacher, or state forestry 6 7 employee. (b) In order for an adopted child to be eligible to receive a 8 9 scholarship benefit: (1) The child must have been adopted prior to the date of the 10 11 death or total and permanent disability of the law enforcement officer, 12 municipal fireman, or state highway employee, state correction employee, state 13 parks employee, teacher, or state forestry employee; or (2) The child's adoption process must have begun prior to the 14 15 date of the death or total and permanent disability of the law enforcement officer, municipal fireman, or state highway employee, state correction 16 employee, state parks employee, teacher, or state forestry employee. 17 18 (c) In order for a stepchild under the age of nineteen (19) to be 19 eligible to receive a scholarship benefit: 20 (1) The stepchild must have been listed as a dependent on the federal and state income tax returns of the law enforcement officer, municipal 21 22 fireman, or state highway employee, state correction employee, state parks 23 employee, teacher, or state forestry employee in each of the five (5) income 24 years immediately prior to the date of the death or total and permanent disability of the law enforcement officer, municipal fireman, or state highway 25 employee, state correction employee, state parks employee, teacher, or state 26 27 forestry employee; and 28 (2) The stepchild must have received more than one-half (1/2) of 29 his or her financial support from the law enforcement officer, municipal 30 fireman, or state highway employee, state correction employee, state parks 31 employee, teacher, or state forestry employee in each of the five (5) income 32 years immediately prior to the date of the death or total and permanent disability of the law enforcement officer, municipal fireman, or state highway 33 employee, state correction employee, state parks employee, teacher, or state 34 35 forestry employee.

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(d) In order for a stepchild nineteen (19) years of age or older to be

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1 eligible to receive a scholarship benefit:

2 (1) The stepchild must have been listed as a dependent on the 3 federal and state income tax returns of the law enforcement officer, municipal fireman, or state highway employee, state correction employee, state parks 4 employee, teacher, or state forestry employee in each of five (5) income years 5 during the eight (8) years immediately prior to the date of the death or total 6 7 and permanent disability of the law enforcement officer, municipal fireman, or 8 state highway employee, state correction employee, teacher, state parks 9 employee, or state forestry employee; and

10 (2) The stepchild must have received more than one-half (1/2) of 11 his or her financial support from the law enforcement officer, municipal 12 fireman, or state highway employee, state correction employee, state parks 13 employee, teacher, or state forestry employee in each of five (5) income years 14 during the eight (8) years immediately prior to the date of the death or total 15 and permanent disability of the law enforcement officer, municipal fireman, or 16 state highway employee, state correction employee, state parks employee, teacher, or state forestry employee. 17

(e) If the covered public employee or his/her heirs did not file for
the available death or disability benefit, but were otherwise eligible to
receive, within the time frame provided in § 21-5-703, then the covered public
employee's child or children, who would have otherwise been eligible to
receive the provided educational scholarship benefit under § 6-82-504, may
individually file, prior to their twenty-first birthdays, a claim to receive
the provided educational scholarship benefit."

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SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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30 SECTION 5. If any provisions of this act or the application thereof to 31 any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect 32 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 33 the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this 34 act are declared to be severable.

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SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
