23	SECTION 1. (a) A firefighter or properly identified law enforcement

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1	SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
2	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
3	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

5	SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
6	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
7	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
8	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
9	act are declared to be severable.

11	SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are

14	SECTION 5. Emergency. <u>It is found and determined by the General</u>
15	Assembly of the State of Arkansas that firefighters and law enforcement

17	of others; and that this act is immediately necessary to protect them from
18	dangerous conditions on the property of others. Therefore, an emergency is
19	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
20	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on
21	the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor
22	vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the
23	period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is
24	vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective
25	on the date the last house overrides the veto.
