" 19 20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 21 22 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 5-28-204 is hereby amended to read as follows: 23 "5-28-204. Persons required to report abuse. (a) Any person or official who is required to report cases of suspected 24 abuse of adults under the provisions of this chapter, who has reasonable cause 25 to suspect that an adult has died as a result of abuse, sexual abuse, or 26 negligence, shall report that fact to the appropriate medical examiner or 27 28 In all cases of death of a long-term care facility resident, the 29 long-term care facility shall immediately report the death to the appropriate 30 coroner. The report is required regardless of whether the facility believes the death to be from natural causes or the result of abuse, sexual abuse, or 31 negligence, or any other cause. In all cases of death of an individual in a 32 hospital who was a resident of a long-term care facility within five (5) days 33 of entering the hospital, the hospital shall immediately report the death to 34 the appropriate coroner. The report is required regardless of whether the 35 facility believes the death to be from natural cause or the result of abuse, 36

2	(b) The medical examiner or coroner shall accept the report for
3	investigation and <u>upon finding reasonable cause to suspect that an adult has</u>

15	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
16	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
17	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
18	act are declared to be severable.
