" 23 24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 25 26 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 20-10-104(e) is hereby amended to read as 27 28 follows: "(e) In cases where a long term care facility or any employee of a long 29 term care facility has custody or legal guardianship of a medicaid recipient, 30 31 nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent representatives of the Department of Human Services, the United States Department of Health and Human 32 Services, or the Office of the Attorney General from taking photographs of the 33 recipient without written consent while investigating circumstances which 34 would constitute Class A or Class B violations. Under such circumstances, the 35 photographs shall be used only for evidentiary purposes in proceedings 36

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1	concerning the alleged violations and shall not be released to the media or to
2	the public. Photographing of residents is prohibited without written consent
3	from the resident or the resident's legal representative except in the course
4	of licensure inspections, medicaid certification, a complaint investigation,
5	investigation of allegations or resident abuse, neglect or misappropriation of
6	resident property or in connection with surveys or investigations made
7	pursuant to law conducted by the Office of Long Term Care, the office of
8	Attorney General, or the United States Department of Health and Human
9	Services. Under such circumstances, the photographs shall be used only for
10	evidentiary purposes in proceedings concerning the alleged violations and
11	shall not be released to the media or to the public, but shall be made
12	available to the facility if utilized to impose a remedy or set forth a
13	statement of deficiency."
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15	SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
16	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
17	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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19	SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
20	any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not
21	affect other provisions or applicants of the act which can be given effect
22	without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
23	of this act are declared to be severable.
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25	SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
26	hereby repealed.
