20	SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS			
21	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL OR TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING			
22	TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this act, the Chief Fiscal			
23	Officer of the State shall transfer on his books and those of the State			
24	Treasurer the sum of One Hundred Sixty Thousand Four Hundred Eighty Nine			
25	Dollars (\$160,489) from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund to the			
26	State Central Services Fund to provide funds for the appropriation provided

29	SECTION 4. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS.	Disbursement of	funds authorized by	
30	this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made			
31	available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions			
32	of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures			
33	Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and			
34	Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this			
35	State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of			
36	Finance and Administration, as authorized b	y law, shall be	strictly complied	

1 with in disbursement of said funds. 2 3 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 4 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 5 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 6 7 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 8 9 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 10 11 12 SECTION 6. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent 13 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas 14 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 15 16 SECTION 7. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act or the application 17 thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall 18 not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given 19 effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the 20 provisions of this act are declared to be severable. 21 22 SECTION 8. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with 23 this act are hereby repealed. SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Eighty-second General Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of the Arkansas Public Defender Commission are, due to

24 25 26 27 unforeseen circumstances, insufficient for the Arkansas Public Defender 28 29 Commission to continue to provide essential governmental services; that the 30 provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies for the Arkansas 31 Public Defender Commission to continue such services; and that a delay in the 32 effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper 33 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an 34 emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the 35 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full

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force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

1	If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
2	effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
3	may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
4	overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the
5	veto.
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
