Arkansas Code 24-3-201(e), regarding the amount of the 26 monthly annuity benefits provisions under the Public Employees Retirement 27 28 System, is amended to read as follows: 29 "(e)(1) Upon a member's retirement, he shall receive an annuity for life equal to the total of the following amounts: 30 31 (A) For each year of credited service in the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System resulting from employment in a position 32 covered at any time by social security or another federal retirement plan 33 34 supported wholly or in part by employer contributions, one and seventy 35 seventy-two hundredths percent (1.70%) (1.72%) of his final average pay plus, for each year of credited service in the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement 36

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- System resulting from employment in a position never so covered, two and five 1 2 seven hundredths percent (2.05%) (2.07%) of his final average pay; 3 (B) For each year of credited service in the State Police 4 Retirement System, one and fifty-five hundredths percent (1.55%) of his final average pay; and 5 (C)(i) For a member of the General Assembly, a monthly 6 7 annuity equal to thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) times the number of years of actual service as a member of the General Assembly; and 8 9 (ii) For a member of the General Assembly who served as Speaker of the House of Representatives or President Pro Tempore of the 10 11 Senate, a monthly annuity equal to forty dollars (\$40.00) times the total 12 number of years of actual service as a member of the General Assembly. 13 (2)(A) In addition, if a member has credited service resulting from employment in a position covered at any time by social security or 14 15 another federal retirement plan supported wholly or in part by employer 16 contributions, and if that member is retiring as provided in subsections (a)-(d) of this section or § 24-3-207(a), and if that member's age at retirement 17 18 is younger than: 19 (i) Social security's minimum age for an immediate 20 retirement benefit: and 21 Age sixty-two (62), then that member of the 22 Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System shall receive a temporary annuity equal to thirty-five thirty-three hundredths percent (0.35%) (0.33%) of his 23 24 final average pay for each year of such credited service. 25 (B) A similar member of the State Police Retirement System 26 shall receive a temporary annuity equal to three hundred twenty-two thousandths percent (0.322%) of his final average pay for each year of 27 28 credited service. 29 (C) The temporary annuity shall terminate at the end of the calendar month in which the earliest of the following events occurs: 30 31 (i) The member's death; 32 (ii) His attainment of the social security minimum
- 34 (iii) His attainment of age sixty-two (62).

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age; or

35 (3) It is considered sound public policy that retirement 36 pay not exceed working pay except for increases after retirement caused by

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inflation. Accordingly, at the time of retirement, the total of named plan 1 2 annuities resulting from employment in a position also covered by social 3 security shall not exceed his final average pay. 4 (4) If no temporary annuity is payable as provided in this 5 subsection, or after such temporary annuity has terminated, and if such member has at retirement any credited service for any period of time prior to July 1, 6 7 1991, then the future payments of such annuity for life shall not be less than they would have been under the provisions that were in effect on July 1, 1990, 8 9 for this subsection, plus a corresponding increase for any benefit enhancements that have been enacted since July 1, 1991." 10 11 12 SECTION 2. Arkansas code § 24-4-601 is amended to read as follows: 13 "24-4-601. Straight life annuity generally. Beginning July 1, 1997 1999, any member who retires, as provided in 14 §§ 24-4-507 - 24-4-512, shall receive a straight life annuity equal to two and 15 five seven hundredths percent (2.05%) (2.07%) of his average compensation 16 multiplied by the number of years, and fraction of a year, of credited service 17 18 with the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System." 19 20 SECTION 3. On July 1, 1999 and thereafter, the monthly benefit payable to the retirants and the beneficiaries of retirants of the Arkansas Public 21 22 Employees Retirement System who retired before July 1, 1989, shall be increased by an amount equal to one percent (1%) of the benefit payable on 23 24 June 1, 1999 for each year or portion of a year of retirement prior to July 1, 25 1989. 26 27 SECTION 4. In addition to the monthly retirement benefit increase provided in Section 3 of this Act, each retirant and beneficiary of a retirant 28 29 of the Arkansas Public Employees Retirement System who retired on or before 30 June 1, 1999, shall receive an increase in his or her monthly benefit of fifty 31 dollars (\$50.00). 32 33 SECTION 5. No benefit enhancement provided for by this act shall be 34 implemented if it would cause the publicly supported retirement system's

unfunded actuarial accrued liabilities to exceed a thirty (30) year

amortization. No benefit enhancement provided for by this act shall be

1	implemented by any publicly supported system which has unfunded actuarial
2	accrued liabilities being amortized over a period exceeding thirty (30) years
3	until the unfunded actuarial accrued liability is reduced to a level less than
4	the standards prescribed by Arkansas Code, Title 24."
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6	SECTION 6. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature
7	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
8	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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10	SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to
11	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
12	other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without
13	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
14	Act are declared to be severable.
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16	SECTION 8. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are
17	hereby repealed.
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19	SECTION 9. <u>EMERGENCY CLAUSE</u> . It is hereby found and determined by the
20	<u>Eighty-second General Assembly, that retirement benefits payable to current</u>
21	and future retirants and beneficiaries of the Arkansas Public Employees
22	Retirement System are inadequate; that the current and future retirant and
23	beneficiary payments should be increased as soon as possible in order to
24	relieve this inequity, and that the effective fiscal administration of the
25	System will be aided by implementing those increases at the same time as the
26	state's fiscal year begins. Therefore, in order to promote sound fiscal
27	administration in State government, an emergency is declared to exist and this
28	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
29	health and safety shall become effective on July 1, 1999.
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
