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23	SECTION 1. This a	act shall be known and may be ci	ted as "The Arkansas
24	Construction Industry Ed	ducation Act".	
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26	SECTION 2. <u>(a)</u>	The General Assembly recognizes	that at any given time
27	the level of activity in	n our national construction indu	stry is the primary
28	yardstick for measuring	the overall economic health of	this country, and that
29	the success and stabili	ty of the building business of t	his state is dependent
30	upon a sufficient supply	y of skilled artisans and crafts	persons who can
31	produce quality projects	s that inspire public confidence	<u>).</u>
32	(b) It is the intent of this act to promote a coordinated effort,		
33	between the construction industry and the vocational and technical schools an		
34	colleges to enhance the availability and the competence of the workforce		
35	supporting the industry	by instituting a craft training	program.
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1	SECTION 3. There is created the Arkansas Construction Industry Craft		
2	Training Education Program which shall be incorporated into the curricula of		
3	existing state vocational schools, technical institutions, and two-year		
4	colleges. The program shall not cause the creation of any new schools or		
5	facilities solely to accommodate or fulfill the requirements of this act.		
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7	SECTION 4. In order to provide for an efficient, competent, and		
8	resourceful construction industry training program that will enhance the		
9	development of a quality labor pool to support the building industry of this		
10	state, there is established the Arkansas Construction Industry Craft Training		
11	Program which will be administered by the Arkansas Department of Workforce		
12	Education in collaboration with the State Apprenticeship Coordination Steering		
13	Committee created by Arkansas Code §6-52-204.		
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15	SECTION 5 The Arkansas Department of Workforce Education and the		
16	Coordination Committee shall promulgate rules necessary to implement the		
17	provisions of this act.		
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19	SECTION 6. <u>In addition to the duties of the Arkansas Apprenticeship</u>		
20	Coordination Steering Committee contained in Arkansas Code §6-52-205, the		
21	Committee is authorized to develop a plan for the Arkansas Construction Craft		
22	Training Program which shall include but not be limited to the following:		
23	(1) Formulas and administrative procedures to be used in requesting		
24	appropriations of state funds for the Construction Craft Training Program;		
25	(2) Forms, formulas and administrative procedures to be used in		
26	distributing funds to construction craft training programs; and		
27	(3) Other administrative procedures or rules as may be necessary for		
28	the equitable and efficient operation of the Construction Craft Training		
29	Program.		
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31	SECTION 7. (a) A surcharge in the amount of fifty cents (.50) per each		
32	one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of construction authorized on any non-		
33	residential construction permit issued by any political subdivision of this		
34	state is imposed to financially support the craft training education program.		
35	(b) The office of the political subdivision issuing the permit shall be		
36	responsible for collecting the surcharge and remitting it monthly to the		

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- 1 Department of Finance and Administration under such rules and regulations as
- 2 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the state may prescribe for the collection,
- 3 enforcement, and administration of the proceeds of the surcharge and shall
- 4 retain five percent (5%) of each permit surcharge collected for the cost of
- 5 administration.

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- 7 SECTION 8. (a) The net proceeds received pursuant to SECTION 7 shall be 8 deposited in a special trust account in the State Treasury known as the 9 "Arkansas Construction Industry Craft Training Trust Fund".
- 10 (b) Programs established or funded by the Arkansas Construction
- Industry Craft Training Trust Fund shall be consistent with the eight (8) 11
- 12 criteria recommended by the Federal Committee on Apprenticeship, U.S.
- 13 Department of Labor, Employment and Training Administration Office of Work
- 14 Based Learning, Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training. The eight (8)
- 15 essential components of an approved apprenticeship program shall include all
- 16 of the following;
- 17 (1) A training strategy that combines supervised, structural on-
- 18 the-job training with related theoretical instruction, and is sponsored by
- 19 employers or labor/management groups that have the ability to hire and train
- 20 in a work environment;
- 21 (2) A training strategy that prepares an individual for skilled
- 22 employment by conducting training in bona fide and documented employment
- 23 settings;
- 24 (3) A training strategy with requirements that are clearly
- 25 delineated in Federal and state laws and regulations;
- 26 (4) A training strategy that by virtue of a legal contract,
- 27 indenture, leads to a Certificate of Completion and official journeyman
- 28 status;
- 29 (5) A training strategy that involves a tangible and generally
- 30 sizable investment on the part of the employer or labor/management program
- 31 sponsor;
- 32 (6) A training strategy that pays wages to its participants at
- 33 least during the on-the-job training phase of their apprenticeship and that
- 34 increases these wages throughout the training program in accordance with a
- 35 predefined wage progression scale;
- (7) A training strategy in which participants learn by working 36

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1	directly under the supervision and tutelage of a master in the craft, trade,
2	or relevant occupational area; and
3	(8) A training strategy that involves a written agreement and an
4	implicit social obligation between the program sponsor and the apprentice.
5	(c) The Arkansas Department of Workforce Education shall, based upon
6	the recommendation of the the State Apprenticeship Coordination Steering
7	Committee, expend the monies in the trust fund, from time-to-time to support
8	the training program prescribed in this act.
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10	SECTION 9. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
11	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
12	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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14	SECTION 10. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
15	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
16	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
17	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
18	act are declared to be severable.
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20	SECTION 11. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
21	hereby repealed.
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
