1 (3) The report shall be predicated on the following definitions: 2 (A) 'Academic department' is defined as each organizational 3 and budgetary unit associated with the delivery of instruction, research, and 4 public service activities; (B) 'Academic program' is defined as all programs of study 5 leading to a degree, or certificate, or diploma, and any other program as 6 7 defined by the Department of Higher Education; (C) 'Academic department and program revenues' shall 8 9 include tuition and fees, both undergraduate and graduate, endowments, gifts and grants, sponsored research, and all other revenues associated with each 10 11 academic department and specific academic programs; 12 (D) 'Academic department and program expenditures' shall 13 include all direct and prorated indirect expenses. 14 (1)(i) Direct expenses include faculty salaries, 15 staff salaries, fringe benefits, scholarships and fellowships, graduate 16 stipends and graduate assistant tuition, student labor, materials and supplies, equipment, travel, and telephone. 17 (2)(ii) Indirect expenses include central 18 19 administrative management, institution-wide services, and departmental 20 administration, student services, research, indirect cost recovery, public services and information, financial aid, plant operations and maintenance, 21 22 utilities, debt service, nonmandatory transfers, and all other indirect 23 expenses. 24 (3)(iii) Total academic department and program 25 expenditures should equal the current funds' expenditures as reported in the 26 institution's financial statement; 27 (E) 'State subsidy' - Within each academic department, any 28 difference between academic program revenues and academic program expenditures 29 shall be determined to be the 'state subsidy' of that academic program and reported annually; and 30 31 (F) 'Productivity by academic program' shall be defined as 32 the number of declared majors, number of upper division undergraduate and graduate student semester credit hours produced, and the number of degrees  $\tau$ 33 and certificates, and diplomas conferred in each program. 34 35 (4) The State Board of Higher Education Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board is authorized to promulgate any rules or regulations 36

necessary for the implementation of this section and shall report to the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education the failure of an institution to comply with the provisions of this section.

- (b)(1) By December 1 September 15 of each year, all state-supported institutions of higher education shall report academic department and program revenues, expenditures, and productivity utilizing the uniform report established by the State Board of Higher Education Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board.
- (2) The academic department and program report shall include an institution's ten (10) highest academic program priorities and shall identify undergraduate and graduate programs that produce fewer graduates than ten (10) graduates annually and graduate programs that produce fewer than five (5) graduates annually required to meet the degree productivity standards set by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board.
- (3) The State Board of Higher Education Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall review the institutional reports and submit them to the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education by January 15 of each odd numbered year.
- (c) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board is further authorized and directed to establish uniform reporting standards to report any other information that may be required to meet any other state or federal statutory or regulatory requirements."

SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
