Jeffress 6 7 8 For An Act To Be Entitled 9 "AN ACT TO AMEND THE STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR 10 FORESTERS ACT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES." 11 12 Subtitle 13 "TO AMEND THE STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION 14 FOR FORESTERS ACT. " 15 16 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 18 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 17-31-101 is amended to read as follows: 19 20 "17-31-101. Title and Purpose. (a) This chapter may be referred to and cited as the 'State Board of 21 22 Registration for Foresters Act'. (b) The purpose of this chapter is to ensure that no person shall use 23 in connection with the person's name, or otherwise assume, use or advertise 24 any title or description that the person is a forester, unless the person is 25 registered as herein provided." 26 27 28 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 17-31-102(2) and (3) pertaining to the 29 definition of forestry is amended to read as follows: "(2) 'Forestry' means the science, the art, and the practice of 30 managing, harvesting, and using, for human benefit primarily, the natural 31 resources which occur on and in association with forestlands. It also means 32 the care and management of forestlands for repeated crops of raw wood 33 products, at annual or somewhat longer intervals, and for allied uses, such as 34 watershed protection, recreation, wildlife, and grazing. However, nothing 35 contained in this chapter shall be construed as preventing any person, firm, 36

- partnership, or corporation from managing woodlands, forests, or trees, or
  from buying or selling timber, or from harvesting any products therefrom, or
  from performing tree planting, timber stand improvement, or other vendor
  services on any land, in any manner desired;
  - (3) 'The practice of professional forestry' includes services for hire such as consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning, or responsible supervision of any forestry activity in connection with public or private lands. The practice of professional forestry also includes teaching of forestry subjects at the college or university level and research in forestry, or a combination of teaching and research. The practice of professional forestry shall not include services rendered for wages, or salary, or payment received for the buying, selling, cutting, handling, or processing of timber, or wages, salary, or payment received for tree planting, timber stand improvement, or other vendor service activities on the forestlands of the owner thereof or on the forestlands of another; and"

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 17-31-104(a) is amended to read as follows:

"(a) The duty of the Attorney General, all prosecuting attorneys, and duly constituted officers of the law of this state or political subdivision thereof shall be <u>authorized</u> to enforce the provisions of this chapter and to prosecute any person violating them."

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 17-31-105(a) is amended to read as follows:

- "(a) Any person required to be registered under this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense or suffer imprisonment for a period not to exceed three (3) months one (1) year, or both, if that person shall:
- 30 (1) Practice or offer to practice *professional* forestry without a valid certificate of registration issued pursuant to this chapter;
- 32 (2) Claim to be a forester certified under this chapter without 33 being so certified;
- 34 (3) In any way tend to convey the impression that he is a 35 forester certified under the provisions of this chapter without being so 36 registered;

1 (4) Use as his own the certificate of registration of another; 2 (5) Give false or forged evidence to the board; 3 (6) Use an expired or revoked certificate; or 4 (7) Violate any provision of this chapter." 5 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 17-31-201 is amended to read as follows: 6 7 "17-31-201. Creation - Selection and compensation of members. (a) The Arkansas State Board of Registration for Foresters is created 8 9 to administer the provisions of this chapter. 10 (b) The board shall consist of six (6) members appointed by the 11 Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate. Each member shall be a 12 citizen of the United States of America and a registered voter and resident of 13 the State of Arkansas. 14 (1) Five (5) members of the board shall be foresters who have the 15 qualifications required for registration under § 17-31-302 and who have been 16 engaged in *professional* forestry for at least twelve (12) years. Each member of the board appointed hereunder shall be required to register registered and 17 18 become certified under this chapter. 19 (A)(i) One (1) member shall be selected from the forest producers products industry or owners; 20 (ii) One (1) member shall be selected from the State 21 22 Forestry Commission; (iii) One (1) member shall be selected from an agency 23 24 of the United States Government; 25 (iv) One (1) member shall be selected from the staff 26 of the school of forestry; and 27 (v) One (1) member shall be selected from private 28 forestry consultants. 29 (B) At least one (1) member shall be a graduate of an 30 approved forestry school within the State of Arkansas. 31 (2) One (1) member of the board shall not be actively engaged in 32 or retired from the forestry profession. That member shall represent 33 consumers. He or she shall be appointed from the state at large subject to 34 confirmation by the Senate and shall be a full voting member but shall not 35 participate in the grading of examinations.

(c)(1) Appointments shall be for a term of five (5) years or, in event

- of vacancies, for the period of the unexpired term of the vacancy being filled.
  - (2) The chairman of the Arkansas Chapter, Ozark Section,

    Division, Ouachita Society of American Foresters, duly authorized and acting
    on behalf of the Arkansas chapterdivision, shall make nominations described in
    subdivision (b)(1) of this section within thirty (30) days from the receipt of
    notice from any person of the occurrence of a vacancy on the board.
  - (d) Each member of the board shall receive a certificate of his appointment from the Governor and before beginning his the term of office shall file with the Secretary of State his written oath or affirmation relative to the faithful discharge of his the official duty.
  - (e) Each member of the board may receive expense reimbursement and stipends in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seq Ark. Code Title 25, Chapter 16, Subchapter 9."

- SECTION 6. Arkansas Code 17-31-202(c) is amended to read as follows:
- "(c)(1) If the member thus served does not request a public hearing within ten (10) days from being served, the Governor may proceed with  $\frac{\text{histhe}}{\text{member's removal}}$ .
  - (2) If the member does request a public hearing, it shall be heard by a special committee composed of three (3) persons, not members of the board, namely:
  - (A) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Arkansas or a substitute selected by the Chief Justice, who shall be the chairman;
  - (B) The chairman of the Arkansas <del>Chapter, Ozark</del> <del>Section, Division, Ouachita Society of American Foresters; and</del>
  - (C) A faculty member, selected by the Arkansas <del>Chapter,</del> Ozark Section, Division, Ouachita Society of American Foresters, from the school or departments of forestry in Arkansas."

- SECTION 7. Arkansas Code 17-31-203(c) is amended to read as follows:
- "(c) The board shall hold a meeting within thirty (30) days after its members are first appointed and, thereafter, shall hold at least two (2) regular meetings each year. Special meetings shall be held at such time and place as shall be specified by call of the chairman or the secretary. Notice of all meetings shall be given in writing to each member by the secretary."

SECTION 8. Arkansas Code 17-31-301(a) and (b) are amended to read as follows:

- "(a) Any person using in connection with <u>his</u> <u>the person's</u> name or otherwise assuming, using, or advertising any title or description tending to convey the impression that <u>hethe person</u> is a <u>registered</u> forester <u>engaged in the practice of forestry on private lands</u> shall be registered as provided in this subchapter.
- (b) <u>All foresters are eligible to apply for registration, however</u> nothingNothing in this chapter shall be construed as requiring:
- (1) Any person, <u>employee of a</u> firm, partnership, corporation, or department or agency of any branch of the government to be registered pursuant to this chapter in order to practice forestry on <u>histhe person's</u> or its own lands or manage <u>histhe persons's</u> or its own timberlands, woodlands, or forests or to supervise the removal of any products therefrom; or
- (2) Any person to be registered pursuant to this chapter in order to practice forestryperform duties as an employee of a registered forester acting under the complete supervision of the registered forester."

- SECTION 9. Arkansas Code 17-31-302 is amended to read as follows: "17-31-302. Qualifications.
- <u>Effective January 1, 2001, the</u> The following shall be considered as minimum evidence satisfactory to the board that an applicant is qualified to be registered as a forester:
- (1)(A) Graduates in a forestry curriculum of four (4) years or more from a school or college approved by the board who are applying for registration without a written examination must, subsequent to graduation, have a specific record of an additional three (3) years' or more experience in forestry work of a character satisfactory to the board; or
- (B) Graduates in a forestry curriculum of four (4) years or more from a school or college approved by the board, who have less than three (3) years' experience in forestry work of a character satisfactory to the board, shall be required to pass a written examination on basic forestry subjects. In addition to passing the written examination, the applicant, in order to qualify for a certificate of registration as a professional forester, shall have a specific record of one (1) year's experience in forestry of a character

satisfactory to the board; or

- (2) Six (6) years or more of experience in forestry work of a character satisfactory to the board and passing a written examination designed to show knowledge and skill approximating that attained through graduation in an approved four-year or more forestry curriculum.
- (1) A bachelor's or advanced degree in forestry from a college or university program accredited by the Society of American Foresters. The written examination on basic forestry subjects administered by the board shall be passed with a score of at least seventy percent (70%).
- (2) A bachelor's or advanced degree in forestry from a college or university program not accredited by the Society of American Foresters and, subject to graduation, three (3) years or more experience in forestry work of a nature satisfactory to the board. The written examination on basic forestry subjects administered by the board shall be passed with a score of at least seventy percent (70%).
- (3) A bachelor's degree in a natural resources related field from a college or university program, including but not limited to, wildlife management, with at least twenty (20) semester hours of forestry courses approved by the board and, subsequent to graduation, three (3) years or more experience in forestry work of a nature satisfactory to the board. The written examination on basic forestry subjects administered by the board shall be passed with a score of at least seventy percent (70%).
- (4) A bachelor's degree not related to natural resources from a college or university program and subsequent to graduation, six (6) years or more experience in forestry work of a nature satisfactory to the board. The written examination on basic forestry subjects administered by the board shall be passed with a score of at least seventy percent (70%).
- (5) A two (2) year associate's degree in forestry from a community college or junior college and subsequent to graduation, six (6) years or more experience in forestry work of a nature satisfactory to the board. The written examination on basic forestry subjects administered by the board shall be passed with a score of at least seventy percent (70%)."

34 SECTION 10. Arkansas Code 17-31-303(b) is amended to read as follows:

"(b) The amount of the application fee and the registration fee shall be set annually by the board. The application fee shall be at least fifteen

- 1 dollars (\$15.00) but not more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The annual
- 2 renewal fee shall be not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than twenty-
- 3 five dollars (\$25.00). The initial application fee will include the first
- 4 year's registration fee."

- SECTION 11. Arkansas Code 17-31-307 is amended to read as follows: "17-31-307. Expiration and renewal.
- (a) Certificates of registration shall expire on December 31 of the year for which issued or renewed and shall become invalid thereafter unless renewed.
  - (b) The secretary of the board shall notify by letter, to the last known address, every person registered under this chapter of the date of the expiration of <a href="https://doi.org/10.1001/j.nc./">https://doi.org/10.1001/j.nc./</a> Notice shall be mailed at least one (1) month in advance of the date of the expiration of such certificate.
  - (c) The board shall require persons who are licensed under this subchapter to complete not less than six (6) hours of continuing forestry education during the previous year beginning January 1, 2001, as a condition of license renewal. Continuing forestry education shall be equivalent to the Society of American Foresters Category I for continuing forestry education which includes, but is not limited to, seminars, short courses and workshops in forestry or a related subject matter as approved by the board.
  - (1) Credit accrues at a rate of one (1) hour for each hour of actual contact. Three (3) hours of tours or field sessions equal one (1) contact hour.
  - (2) The board may approve continuing forestry education courses offered by professional organizations, institutions of higher learning, qualified individuals, or specialty societies. The board may approve credit hours for meetings, presentations, or other activities considered by the board to be a form of continuing forestry education.
- 31 (3) A successful applicant for licensure under this subchapter
  32 shall have two (2) years from the date the license is issued to complete the
  33 first six (6) hours of continuing forestry education. After two (2) years,
  34 the registered forester shall complete the continuing forestry education
  35 requirements as required by this subsection.
  - (d) The board may waive the continuing forestry education requirements

in cases of hardship, illness, or retirement from active forestry practice.

- (e) The board may promulgate rules and regulations to ensure compliance with the requirements of this section.
- (c) (f) Renewal of certificate of registration shall be for an annual fee set annually by the board. This fee shall be at least five dollars (\$5.00) but not more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).
- (d)(q) The failure on the part of any registrant to renew histhe certificate annually in the month of December as required above shall not deprive the person of the right of renewal, but the fee to be paid for the renewal of a certificate after December 31 shall be increased ten percent (10%) for each month or fraction of a month that payment of renewal is delayed. However, the maximum fee for delayed renewal shall not exceed twice the normal annual renewal fee."

SECTION 12. Arkansas Code 17-31-308 is amended to read as follows: "17-31-308. Reciprocity.

Upon application therefor and the payment of a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)set by the board, the board may issue a certificate of registration as a registered forester in Arkansas to any qualified person of any state of the United States or its possessions, or Canada, provided that:

- (1) The person is a legally registered forester or the equivalent in <a href="histhe person">histhe person</a>'s own state or province and has submitted evidence satisfactory to the board that <a href="heteron">heteron</a> is so registered and that the requirements therein are substantially equivalent to the requirements of registration under this chapter; and
- (2) The state in which <u>hethe person</u> is so registered will accept the certificates of registration issued by this board on a reciprocal basis."

SECTION 13. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 14. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
