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9 "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE
10 ON THE STATE CAPITOL GROUNDS OF AN APPROPRIATE
11 MONUMENT TO HONOR ARKANSANS WHO HAVE BEEN AWARDED THE
12 CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

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15 "TO AUTHORIZE CONSTRUCTION OF A MONUMENT
16 ON THE STATE CAPITOL GROUNDS TO HONOR
17 ARKANSANS WHO HAVE BEEN AWARDED THE
18 CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR."
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly
24 that several Arkansans have been awarded the prestigious Congressional Medal
25 of Honor and that those brave individuals have not received from fellow
26 Arkansans the recognition and honor they deserve. It is further found and
27 determined by the Arkansas General Assembly that an appropriate monument
28 should be established and maintained on the grounds of the State Capitol as a
29 symbol of recognition, honor, and appreciation to all those Arkansans who have
30 heretofore or may hereafter be awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.
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32 SECTION 2. The Secretary of State is authorized to assist and
33 coordinate with the Arkansas Medal of Honor Commission in the construction on
34 the grounds of the State Capitol a monument to honor Arkansans who have been
35 or may hereafter be awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.
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1 SECTION 3. The design of the monument shall be approved by the Arkansas
2 Medal of Honor Commission and the Arkansas Capitol Arts and Grounds
3 Commission. The location of the monument on the Capitol grounds shall be
4 approved by the Arkansas Capitol Arts and Grounds Commission and the Arkansas
5 Medal of Honor Commission.

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7 SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
8 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
9 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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11 SECTION 5. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
12 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
13 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
14 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
15 act are declared to be severable.

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17 SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
18 hereby repealed.

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20 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
21 Eighty-second General Assembly that a delay in the effective date of this act
22 would work irreparable harm on the proper administration of essential
23 governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this
24 act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
25 health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the
26 Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it
27 shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which
28 the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the
29 veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house
30 overrides the veto.
