20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the Post
23 Prison Transfer Board for the 1999-2001 biennium, the following maximum number
24 of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the
25 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et
26 seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however,
27 that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein
28 in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification
29 and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are
30 hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and
31 Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

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10 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the Post Prison

11 Transfer Board, to be payable from the State General Services Fund Account,

12 for personal services and operating expenses of the Post Prison Transfer Board

13 for the biennial period ending June 30, 2001, the following:

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27 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE

28 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ASSISTANCE

29 PROVISION. The Department of Correction and the Department of Community

30 Punishment may provide services, furnishings, equipment and office space to

31 assist the Post Prison Transfer Board in fulfilling the purposes for which the

32 Board was created by law.

33

34 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE

35 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING

36 TRANSFER. The Chairman of the Post Prison Transfer Board is hereby authorized

1 to request a fund transfer from the Department of Correction Inmate Care and
2 Custody Fund Account to the State General Services Fund Account for the
3 Regular Salaries and Personal Services Matching for a Post Prison Transfer
4 Board - Hearing Examiner. Such transfers shall require the prior approval of
5 *the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and shall not exceed \$75,480 in either*
6 *fiscal year of the 1999-2001 biennium.*

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8 SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by
9 this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made
10 available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions
11 of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures
12 Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and
13 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
14 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
15 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
16 with in disbursement of said funds.

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18 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
19 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
20 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
21 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
22 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
23 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
24 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint
25 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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27 SECTION 7. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
28 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
29 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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31 SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act or the application
32 thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall
33 not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given
34 effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
35 provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

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1 SECTION 9. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with
2 this act are hereby repealed.

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4 SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
5 Eighty-second General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
6 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
7 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1999 is essential to the operation of
8 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
9 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
10 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1999 could work irreparable harm upon the
11 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
12 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
13 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
14 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1999.
