2	SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
3	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
4	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

6	SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
7	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
8	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
9	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
10	act are declared to be severable.

12	SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
13	hereby repealed.

15	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
16	Eighty-second General Assembly that Act 1289 of 1997 has created substantial
17	<u>hardships on industry which were not intended when the law was passed, is</u>
18	making it difficult or impossible for industry to hire qualified employees to
19	perform industrial electrical work due to a shortage of qualified, licensed
20	journeyman and master electricians in Arkansas, and is restricting the ability
21	of industrial contractors to staff major industrial projects with personnel
22	from other states which do not impose similar licensing requirements.
23	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately
24	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall
25	become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is
26	neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the
27	expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill.
28	If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall
29	become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
