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3	SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
4	hereby repealed.

6	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
7	Eighty-second General Assembly that publication of the notice of sale three
8	times prior to selling school bonds is unnecessary and expensive. To help
9	school districts to cut costs of issuing bonds, this act should be given
10	immediate effect. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act
11	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health
12	and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor.
13	If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
14	effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
15	may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
16	overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the
17	veto.
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
