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22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 17-29-202(b) is amended to read as follows:		
23	"(b) The board shall hold <u>at least</u> two (2) examinations each year at

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- 12 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 17-29-302(a) and (b) are amended to read as 13 follow:
- "(a) Every person who desires to engage in the business of funeral 14 15 directing in this state shall:
- 16 Be of good moral character and at least eighteen (18) years (1) 17 of age;
- 18 (2) Be a graduate of an accredited high school or the equivalent 19 thereof;
 - (3) Have served as an apprentice funeral director for not less than twenty-four (24) months in the State of Arkansas under the direct supervision of an Arkansas licensed funeral director. Completion of the requirement to be a graduate of a school of embalmers as set forth in § 17-29-301(a)(3) may be substituted for twelve (12) of the twenty-four (24) months apprenticeship established herein;
- 26 (4) Make application to the board attaching fee as prescribed in 27 § 17-29-208; and
- (5) Present himself or herself before the board at a time and 29 place fixed by the board and make a passing grade on both the written and oral examinations.
- 31 (b)(1) Any person desiring to engage in the business of funeral 32 directing in the State of Arkansas shall serve an apprenticeship of two (2) years in the State of Arkansas under a funeral director licensed by this 33 34 board, and that person shall actively assist in conducting fifty (50) 35 funerals. Notice of the apprenticeship shall be recorded with the secretary of the board, and by the licensed funeral director supervising the 36

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apprenticeship, not later than thirty (30) days after the commencement of the apprenticeship.

- (2) If any person is a graduate of an accredited mortuary college program and has passed both written and oral examinations given by the board the National Board Examination, that person shall be required to serve one (1) year as an apprentice funeral director.
- (3) The board shall have the power to suspend or revoke a certificate of apprenticeship for violation of any provision of this subchapter or subchapter 2 of this chapter."

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 17-29-304(h) is amended to read as follows:

"(h) Mobile homes or mobile units are prohibited for use as a funeral establishment or branch thereof. No mobile home or mobile units shall be used for the performance of any function or service of a funeral establishment except in case of emergency as prescribed by the board. Mobile homes, modular units, manufactured homes, and similar mobile units may be granted a replacement license on a case by case basis."

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 17-29-305(b) is amended to read as follows:

"(b) When an establishment changes ownership, the license then in force and effect shall be honored for the new owner until that license has expired board shall be notified, in writing, within thirty (30) days. At that time, a new license shall be issued in the name of the new establishment, providing that the requirements for licenses as established herein are met."

SECTION 6. Arkansas Code 17-29-310 is amended to read as follows: "17-29-310. License requirements for out-of-state licenses.

Any person holding a valid, unrevoked, and unexpired license as an embalmer or funeral director in another state, territory, or provincial authority, may apply for license to practice in this state as an embalmer or funeral director, or both. Application shall be made by filing with the secretary-treasurer of the board a certified statement from the secretary of the examining board of the state, U.S. territory or provincial authority in which the applicant holds his or her license showing the basis upon which the license was issued. Upon receipt of the application, the secretary of the board may issue temporary working numbers, which are valid for one year from

1	the date of issuance. To obtain a license, the applicant shall pass an exam to		
2	prove his or her proficiency, including at least, but not limited to, a		
3	knowledge of the laws, rules and regulations of this state pertaining to		
4	funeral service. The exam may be taken at one of the regularly scheduled exam		
5	sessions set by the board. If the board is satisfied with the proficiency of		
6	the applicant, upon receipt of the prescribed fees in § 17-29-208, a license		
7	may be granted. Failure to meet testing requirements shall result in		
8	revocation of the temporary working numbers and the applicant must reapply and		
9	pay the appropriate fee."		
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11	SECTION 7. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature		
12	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code		
13	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.		
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15	SECTION 8. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to		
16	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect		
17	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without		
18	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this		
19	act are declared to be severable.		
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21	SECTION 9. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are		
22	hereby repealed.
