19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21	SECTION 1. <u>Intent.</u>		
22	It is the intent of the General Assembly that expenditures of state funds for		
23	distance Learning technology promote statewide access to a shared-use network		
24	infrastructure, foster open standards for applications, optimize benefits,		
25	create opportunities for innovation in state government, and transform		
26	institutional and budget	ing behavior.

28	SECTION 2. For th	e purposes of this act, "dista	ance Learning" means
29	education and training that takes place when the student and the teacher are		
30	separated by space or time and the gap between them is bridged through the		
31	help of technology, including connecting students and teachers by way of the		
32	World Wide Web and inter	active videoconferencing.

34	SECTION 3. Coordination required.		
35	No funds appropriated for any state agency, board, office, commission or		
36	institution shall be used for the technological implementation of distance		

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1	learning until the plan for the spending of such funds for distance learning		
2	technology has been prepared by the state agency, board, office, commission or		
3	institution and submitted to the Department of Information Systems' Office of		
4	Information Technology. The Office of Information Technology shall develop		
5	model criteria for the users of distance learning technology to insure		
6	compatibility and maintain the integrity of the statewide network		
7	infrastructure. The model distance learning criteria shall include accepted		
8	technological standards for voice, video, and data communications so that the		
9	quality of service can be optimized throughout the statewide network		
10	infrastructure. The Office of Information Technology shall report monthly to		
11	the Governor and the Joint Committee on Advanced Telecommunications and		
12	Information Technology on its activities regarding distance learning.

14	SECTION 4. All provisions of this section shall expire on July 1, 2001.

16	SECTION 5. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature		
17	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code		
18	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

20	SECTION 6. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to		
21	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect		
22	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without		
23	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this		
24	act are declared to be severable.

26	SECTION 7. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are		
27	hereby repeal ed.
