36	There is established the Arkansas National Guard Scholarship Program to		

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provide scholarships to eligible students for four (4) years of study at a
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     state-supported Arkansas college or university or assistance for training at a
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     state-supported vocational and technical school who agree to serve with any
     service component unit of the Arkansas National Guard and, upon graduation,
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     agree to serve an additional six (6) years in the Arkansas National Guard.

           (a) There is established the Arkansas National Guard Scholarship
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     Selection Committee consisting of five (5) members who are appointed by and

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     accredited state-supported Arkansas college or university.
           (c) The student must have demonstrated academic excellence at the high
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     school Level.
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           (d) The student must meet mental and physical health standards required
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     for membership in the Arkansas National Guard.

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           6-82-807. College scholarships - Maintaining eligibility.
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           (a) The recipient must maintain required academic standards. This
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     requirement may be waived upon majority vote of the committee.

11	(a) The student shall be informed of the scholarship through the	
12	combined efforts of the college, the Arkansas National Guard, and high schoo	
13	counsel ors.	
14	(b) The student shall request an application from his or her Arkansas	
15	National Guard unit commander.	
16	(c) The unit commander mails an application, which is supplied by the	
17	authority, to the student.	
18	(d) The student completes an application, writes an essay stating why	
19	he or she thinks he or she is deserving of the scholarship and discusses his	
20	or her career goals, submits an official copy of his or her high school	
21	transcript or General Educational Development test score sheet, as well as t	
22	official copy of the Scholastic Aptitude Test scores or American College Test	
23	-scores, and sends them back to the unit commander, along with a full-length	
24	photograph of himself or herself.	
25	(e) If the unit commander chooses to nominate the student, he or she	
26	must sign the application and send it to the authority along with the	
27	student's completed application package.	
28	(f) The deadline date for applications to be in to the authority is

30	(g) After the application is received by the authority, a medical	
31	report form is sent to the student. The student must complete his or her	
32	section and obtain a physical examination. The physician completes the form	
33	and forwards it to the authority.

36	(a) The authority must receive the application information from the	

1 unit commander through command channels by January 1.

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- 2 (b) Applicants who do not meet the eligibility requirements of 3 residency, academic excellence, and qualification for regular admission to the 4 college or university shall be eliminated by the authority.
 - (c) The eligible nominees shall be evaluated by the authority based on high school grade average, General Educational Development Test subjective equivalency, Scholastic Aptitude Test score, or American College Test score, extracurricular activities, leadership ability, the quality of the student's essay, the unit commander's comments and references.
- 10 (d) By February 1, the authority shall have no more than twenty-four 11 (24) nominees selected.
