(c) Any holder of a state-issued heating, ventilation, air conditioning

6	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 17-28-301(d) is amended to read as follows:		
7	"(d) The board shall be authorized to issue a temporary license as a		
8	master electrician $_{ au}$ <u>or</u> journeyman electrician <del>, residential master electrician,</del>		
9	and residential journeyman electrician, which shall be valid for no more than		
10	six (6) months <del>, provided the applicant has not previously been issued a</del>		
11	temporary license, and be renewable one (1) time only for industry projects as		
12	defined in this chapter, upon submission by the applicant of the following:

21	SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature		
22	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code		
23	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

25	SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to		
26	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect		
27	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without		
28	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this		
29	act are declared to be severable.

31	SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are		
32	hereby repealed.

34	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the		
35	Eighty-second General Assembly that Act 1289 of 1997 is making it difficult or		
36	impossible for industry to hire new employees to perform electrical work due		

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1	to a severe shortage in licensed journeyman and master electricians in
2	Arkansas. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
3	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
4	safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If
5	the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
6	effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
7	may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
8	overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the
9	veto.
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
