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24	WHEREAS, the export of agricultural commodities has provided the	Uni t	ed
25	States the only positive return on its balance of trade; and		
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27	WHEREAS, the only way to insure that a positive return on the ba	I ance	of
28	trade continues is to allow international markets to remain open; and		
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30	WHEREAS, the use of unilateral economic sanctions rarely achieve	its	
31	goal, but cause substantial harm to the producers of products; and		
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33	WHEREAS, not only do the sanctions imposed by the United States		
34	great harm to the Arkansas farmer, but so do the unfair trade barriers	and	
35	sanctions imposed on agricultural products by other countries; and		
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1	WHEREAS, the storage of grain on the ground in Arkansas is just one
2	example of the adverse affects sanctions have on agricultural products; and
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4	WHEREAS, economic sanctions hinder the export of agricultural products,
5	exacerbating the transportation of such products and possibly lowering the
6	price received by the Arkansas farmer for such agricultural products:
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8	NOW THEREFORE,
9	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
10	STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
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12	That Congress remove or restrict the use of trade sanctions as they
13	apply to agricultural products and that Congress insures that the use of trade
14	sanctions will result in meaningful results; and
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16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that Congress work for the reduction and
17	elimination of trade barriers and sanctions imposed by other countries against
18	agricultural products; and

22	the Vice President of the United States, Majority Leader and Minority Leader
