areas have been designated and the development of comprehensive plans has
progressed resulting in the White River-Grand Prairie project being authorized
for construction by the Congress in 1998,

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The General Assembly hereby expresses its sincere appreciation to the Arkansas Congressional Delegation for its efforts to address the critical groundwater problems in the State and respectfully requests the members of that delegation to work in a spirit of cooperation and determination toward achieving the goals as outlined by the Boeuff Tensas, Bayou Meto and Grand Prairie water distribution districts in their efforts to reverse the severe trend occurring in the Arkansas water supply.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Assembly, on behalf of all Arkansans, respectfully urges the Arkansas Congressional Delegation to remain committed to securing total funding for these projects and to take appropriate action to eliminate the cost sharing requirements currently placed on Arkansas.
