26	require their attendance between the hours of three o'clock p.m. (3:00 p.m.)

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29	WHEREAS, research has shown that students who work up to twenty hours per week
30	in after school employment may benefit academically from their experiences in
31	the workplace; and
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33	WHEREAS, research has also pointed out the adverse impact that employment over
34	thirty hours per week during the school year has on a student's grades and
35	attendance; and

WHEREAS, legislation has been offered in previous meetings of the Arkansas General Assembly to restrict the hours that high school students may work during the school year; and WHEREAS, the issues and concerns raised by parents, educators, and employers over the previous attempts to restrict the hours that high school students may work during the school year merit careful consideration and discussion. NOW THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN: That the Senate Interim Committee on Education and the House Interim Committee on Education are requested to conduct a study on the impact of after school employment on the academic performance of Arkansas high school students and to make recommendations for appropriate statutory changes prior to the convening of the next regular session of the General Assembly. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate Interim Committee on Education and the House Interim Committee on Education shall report the results of this study by no later than October 1, 2000.
