17	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
18	STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, A MAJORITY OF ALL
19	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:
20	
21	That the following is hereby proposed as an amendment to the
22	Constitution of the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the
23	electors of the state for approval or rejection at the next general election
24	for Senators and Representatives, if a majority of the electors voting thereon
25	at such election, adopt such amendment, the same shall become a part of the
26	Constitution of the State of Arkansas, to wit:
27	
28	SECTION 1. Section 2 of Amendment 73 of the Constitution of the State
29	of Arkansas is amended to read as follows:
30	"Section 2. Legislative Branch.
31	(a) The Arkansas House of Representatives shall consist of members to
32	be chosen every second year by the qualified electors of the several counties.
33	No member of the Arkansas House of Representatives may serve more than <del>three</del>
34	six such two year terms. <u>A member of the Arkansas House of Representatives</u>
35	who is in office on November 7, 2000 shall only be eligible to serve three (3)
36	such two (2) year terms including any terms served prior to the effective date

2	(b) The Arkansas Senate shall consist of members to be chosen every
3	four years by the qualified electors of the several districts. No member of
4	the Arkansas Senate may serve more than $\frac{1}{100}$ $\frac{1}{100}$ such four year terms.
5	(1) A member of the Arkansas Senate who is in office on November
6	7, 2000 shall only be eligible to serve two (2) such four (4) year terms
7	including any terms served prior to the effective date of this Amendment.
8	(2) A member of the Arkansas Senate who has served twelve (12)
9	years, but has not served three (3) full terms may serve the remainder of the
10	third term."
11	
12	SECTION 2. This Amendment shall be effective on January 1, 2001.
