10 EXPRESSING THE RESPECT OF THE MEMBERS OF THE ARKANSAS
11 SENATE FOR HIS CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE STATE OF
12 ARKANSAS. "

15 "IN RESPECTFUL MEMORY OF THOMAS BENTON
16 SMITH AND EXPRESSING THE RESPECT OF THE
17 MEMBERS OF THE ARKANSAS SENATE FOR HIS
18 CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE STATE OF ARKANSAS. "

21 WHEREAS, the career of Thomas Benton Smith of Wynne included service as
22 county attorney and deputy prosecuting attorney for Cross County, municipal
23 judge for Cherry Valley and city attorney for Hickory Ridge; and

25 WHEREAS, Thomas Smith twice was appointed to serve as special Arkansas
26 Supreme Court Justice, in 1987 and 1992; and

28 WHEREAS, he belonged to the American Bar Association and the Arkansas
29 Bar Association, the Arkansas Trial Lawyers Association, and was president of
30 the Cross County Bar Association; and

32 WHEREAS, Thomas Smith actively supported the democratic process through
33 extensive involvement in the Democratic Party, including work as State
34 Democratic Committee Treasurer for 10 years, delegate to the national
35 convention in 1976 and 1980, chairman of the Cross County Democratic Central
36 Committee and delegate to every Arkansas Democratic State Convention since

1 1974; and

3 WHEREAS, his tireless work for open and fair elections made him a
4 successful and respected Chairman of the Cross County Election Commission; and

5
6 WHEREAS, Thomas Benton Smith was devoted to protecting the natural
7 resources of Arkansas, being a charter member and founding area chairman of
8 the Shaver-Farmer chapter of Ducks Unlimited, as well as state chairman of
9 Arkansas Ducks Unlimited in 1984 and 1985; and

10
11 WHEREAS, he was a reliable and active participant in community and
12 church affairs, dedicating his time to service as a deacon of the Wynne
13 Presbyterian Church and as founding president of the board of Little Sheep Day
14 Care at the Wynne Presbyterian Church; and

15
16 WHEREAS, his involvement supported the Wynne Rotary Club, the Wynne
17 Chamber of Commerce and the Wynne Fumble Club, and he was chosen to provide
18 his talents as a board member of the Arkansas Community Foundation; and

20 WHEREAS, he loved his native state and its people; and

21
22 WHEREAS, Thomas Benton Smith, age 50, died on January 13, 1999; and

23
24 WHEREAS, Thomas Benton Smith, a son of Winnie Bob Smith of Birdeye and
25 the late James Harmon Smith, is survived by his mother; his wife, Counts
26 Felton Smith; a son, Thomas Benton Smith Jr.; a daughter, Counts Louise Smith;
27 his sisters, Carolyn Smith Rafferty and Meredith Smith Schweighart; and his
28 brothers, Harmond Smith and Bill Smith.

30 NOW THEREFORE,

31 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
32 STATE OF ARKANSAS:

34 THAT the members of the Arkansas Senate wish to honor the memory of
35 Thomas Benton Smith by expressing their respect for his life's work, their
36 gratitude for his contributions to Arkansas and their most sincere and
