18	WHEREAS, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., as the principal founder of the
19	Civil Rights Movement in the 1950s and 1960s, led the battle against racism
20	recognizing that all people are entitled to dignity, equality, due process,
21	and all constitutional freedoms that were so carefully crafted by the founding
22	fathers of our country; and
23	WHEREAS, through the utilization of civil disobedience, Dr. King caused
24	this country to examine laws and practices that were discriminatory to a large
25	number of our citizens; and
26	WHEREAS, although the practice of civil disobedience resulted in his
27	being jailed, Dr. King continued to foster change through nonviolent means,
28	brotherly love, and the Golden Rule of "Do unto others as you would have them
29	do unto you"; and
30	WHEREAS, Dr. King fought hard against injustice and for a new birth of
31	freedom; and
32	WHEREAS, although an assassin's bullet ended his life in Memphis,
33	Tennessee in 1968, his legacy and his teaching live on; and
34	WHEREAS, the civil rights legislation that was enacted by the United
35	States Congress within a few months after Dr. King's death is evidence to all
36	of us that his efforts were not in vain,

1	NOW THEREFORE,
2	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
3	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
