1	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 24-7-713(b)(2), concerning an additional		
2	monthly benefit under the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, is amended to		
3	read as follows:		
4	(2) Members retiring after July 1, 1999, with five (5) or more		
5	years of credited service in the retirement system, shall receive an		
6	additional benefit of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month over and		
7	above their regular annuity. Provided, the board may elect and is granted		
8	authority to increase the additional benefit to members retiring in an amount		
9	determined by the board, except such additional benefit shall not exceed one		
10	hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125) per month.

12	SECTION 3. [THE ARKANSAS CODE REVISION COMMISSION IS NOT REQUIRED TO

22	SECTION 4. <u>Emergency Clause</u> . It is found and determined by the Eighty-

25	employees than with public employees; that allowing the nonteaching employees		
26	to earn service credit in the Teacher Retirement System will promote more		
27	effective use of educational funds in Arkansas; and that in order to promote		
28	the proper operation of the school districts these laws need to be effective		
29	at the beginning of the state's fiscal year. Therefore an emergency is		
30	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the		
31	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective
