Arkansas Code 16-32-103 is amended to read as follows: 16-32-103. Master list. 27 (a) During the month of November or December of each year, the 28 29 prospective jurors for the following calendar year shall be selected from among the current list of registered voters of the licensed drivers and 30 persons issued an identification card under § 27-16-805, who are eighteen (18) 31 years of age or old<u>er, and are residing in the</u> applicable district or county 32 33 in the following manner: (1) The circuit judge, in the presence of the circuit clerk, 34 35 shall select at random a number between one (1) and one hundred (100), inclusive, which shall be the starting number, and the circuit court shall 36

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- 1 then select the person whose name appears on the current; voter registration
- 2 list in that numerical position, counting sequentially from the first name on
- the list of licensed drivers and persons issued an identification card under § 3
- 27-16-805, who are eighteen (18) years of age or older, in that numerical 4
- position, counting sequentially from the first name on the list. 5
- 6 (2) The circuit clerk shall then select the one hundredth (100th) 7 voter registrant name appearing on the list after the starting number. As an 8 example, if the starting number is sixty-seven (67), which is the first 9 selection, the second selection would be the one hundred sixty-seventh (167th) 10 registered voter name, the third selection would be the two hundred 11 sixty-seventh (267th) registered voter name, and so forth until the current
- 12 registered voter list is exhausted.
 - (3) The circuit judge and the circuit clerk shall then repeat the random selection process until the number of jurors set out in this subsection have been selected.
- 16 (b) The number of persons to be selected shall be based upon the number 17 of qualified registered voters licensed drivers and persons issued an
- 18 identification card under § 27-16-805, who are eighteen (18) years of age or
- 19 older, in the appropriate district or county as reflected by the current list
- 20 of registered voters licensed drivers and persons issued an identification
- 21 card under § 27-16-805, who are eighteen years of age or older, provided by
- 22 the county clerk under legal requirements Department of Finance and
- 23 Administration and, unless a larger number is designated by the circuit judge,
- 24 the minimum number selected shall be as follows:

- (c) After the list of prospective jurors has been submitted by the circuit clerk, the circuit judge may, in the exercise of his discretion, authorize clerical assistance in preparing the alphabetized master list and separate cards, chips, disks, or other appropriate means of including the names and addresses of the prospective jurors in the wheel or box.
- (1) The expense of this clerical help shall be paid by the county as an expense of the administration of justice.
 - (2) Clerical employees shall take the following oath:
- "I will not make known to anyone the names of the prospective jurors who have been selected and I will not, directly or indirectly, converse with anyone selected as a juror concerning the merits of any proceeding pending or likely to come before the grand jury or court until after the case is tried or otherwise finally disposed of."
- (d) Subsections (a)-(c) of this section shall be applicable to all circuit courts and counties within the state.
- (e) All circuit clerks who maintain voter registration lists on computers, whether in house or contracted, may utilize the computers and associated equipment for the purpose of selecting jury panels from the voter registration lists of licensed drivers and persons issued identification cards under § 27-16-805, who are eighteen years of age or older. The master list of jurors' names and addresses shall not be available for public inspection, publication, or copying, but it may be examined in the presence of the circuit judge by litigants or their attorneys who desire to verify that names drawn from the wheel or box were placed there in the manner provided in this act by the commissioners.

- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 16-32-201(b) is amended to read as follows:
- (b) Circuit courts to which criminal cases are assigned may call grand jurors from the wheel or box from which petit jurors are drawn, or the circuit judge may direct the jury commissioners to provide the minimum number of names

3	commissioners to provide the minimum number of names for a separate grand jury
4	wheel or box, the jury commissioners shall select the names of persons whom

6	licensed drivers and persons issued identification cards under § 27-16-805,
7	who are eighteen years of age or older.
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9	SECTION 3. The Department of Finance and Administration shall no later
10	than October 31 of each year provide to the circuit clerk of each county a
11	list of all persons licensed by the department to operate motor vehicles and
12	persons issued identification cards under § 27-16-805, who are eighteen (18)
13	years of age or older, and who reside within the counties which the circuit
14	clerk serves.
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
