Stricken language would be deleted from and underlined language would be added to the law as it existed prior to this session of the General Assembly.

AN ACT TO REQUI RE THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTION COMMI SSI ONERS TO STUDY THE FEASIBI LITY OF ESTABLISHING A STATEWIDE UNIFORM BALLOT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTION COMMI SSI ONERS TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING A STATEWI DE UNIFORM BALLOT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. It is found and determined by the General Assembly that
establishing a statewide uniform ballot will lead to more efficient and non-
discriminatory elections. Currently Arkansas counties vote by various
methods, including but not I imited to, paper ballots, voting machines,
computer machines, and punch-card voting. This variance in the forms of
voting may result in confusion for the voters.

SECTION 2. (a) The State Board of Election Commissioners shall study:
(1) The feasibility of establishing a statewide uniform ballot; (2) The various forms of voting throughout the state; (3) The feasibility of a uniform statewide voting system; (4) The costs associated with implementing statewide uniform

## ballots; and

(5) Methods of voting by other states.
(b) The board shall provide an opportunity for county boards of
election commissioners to submit written and oral presentations regarding
their concerns, comments, and proposals.
(c) The board shall, by September 30, 2002, provide the House and
Senate Interim Committees on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs a report
outlining its concerns, feasibility, fiscal impact, and any proposed
Iegislation for the implementation of a statewide uniform ballot.
