HOUSE BILL 1106

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTION
COMMISSIONERS TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING
A STATEWIDE UNIFORM BALLOT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTION
COMMISSIONERS TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY
OF ESTABLISHING A STATEWIDE UNIFORM
BALLOT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. It is found and determined by the General Assembly that establishing a statewide uniform ballot will lead to more efficient and non-discriminatory elections. Currently Arkansas counties vote by various methods, including but not limited to, paper ballots, voting machines, computer machines, and punch-card voting. This variance in the forms of voting may result in confusion for the voters.

SECTION 2. (a) The State Board of Election Commissioners shall study:
(1) The feasibility of establishing a statewide uniform ballot;
(2) The various forms of voting throughout the state;
(3) The feasibility of a uniform statewide voting system;
(4) The costs associated with implementing statewide uniform
ballots; and
(5) Methods of voting by other states.
(b) The board shall provide an opportunity for county boards of

1 election commissioners to submit written and oral presentations regarding
2 their concerns, comments, and proposals.

3 (c) The board shall, by September 30, 2002, provide the House and
4 Senate Interim Committees on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs a report
5 outlining its concerns, feasibility, fiscal impact, and any proposed
6 legislation for the implementation of a statewide uniform ballot.
