32	or punitive damages, arising from a rail incident or accident occurring in

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ı	(b)(1) The owner of a for-profit passenger excursion train sharr		
2	maintain insurance coverage of not less than twenty million dollars		
3	(\$20,000,000) per occurrence, with the railroad or rail authority over whose		
4	tracks the special passenger excursion train is operated as named insureds.		
5	(2) The insurance shall not have a self-insured retention or		
6	deductible greater than two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000).		
7	(3) The owner of the for-profit passenger excursion train shall		
8	provide evidence of the coverage upon demand by the State Highway Commission		
9	or by the railroad or rail authority over whose tracks the for-profit		
10	passenger excursion train is to be operated.		
11	(c) Nothing in this section shall be construed as requiring a railroa		
12	or rail authority to permit the operation of a for-profit passenger excursion		
13	train over its tracks.		
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
