Arkansas Code 27-15-305(b), concerning penalties for parking in 23 disabled parking spaces, is amended to read as follows: 24 25 (b) Any vehicle found to be parked in an area designated for the 26 exclusive use of any person with a disability, including the access aisle, as provided in this subchapter, on which is not displayed a special license 27 plate, a special certificate, or an official designation of another state as 28 29 authorized in this subchapter or which is found to be parked in an area 30 designated for the exclusive use of any person with a disability, if operated by a person who is not a person with a disability, while not being used for 31 32 the actual transporting of a person with a disability, shall be subject to 33 impoundment by the appropriate law enforcement agency. In addition thereto, the owner of the vehicle shall upon conviction be subject to a fine of not 34 less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500) 35 36 for the first offense and not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for the second and subsequent offense, 37

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- 1 plus applicable towing, impoundment, and related fees as well as court costs.
- 2 and, upon a second or subsequent conviction, the court shall suspend the
- 3 <u>driver's license for up to six (6) months. The driver may apply to the Office</u>
- 4 <u>of Driver Services of the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration</u>
- 5 for a restricted license during the period of suspension. The office shall
- 6 <u>determine the conditions of the restricted license or may deny the request for</u>
- 7 <u>a restricted license after reviewing the driving record and circumstances of</u>
- 8 the dri ver.

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- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 27-15-307 is amended to read as follows:
- 11 27-15-307. Administration.
- 12 The office shall:
 - (1) Develop an appropriate form, including provision for a sworn statement of disability, for use by an applicant to request issuance of the special license plate and the special certificate for a person with a disability;
 - (2) Distribute a copy of this subchapter to all appropriate law enforcement agencies charged with enforcement of the Motor Vehicle Code;
 - (3) Adopt procedures and promulgate rules to advise and inform the general public of the provisions of this subchapter and the availability of special license plates and special certificates;
 - (4) Request medical information directly related to determining the eligibility of the applicant for a special license plate or special certificate, which shall be held in strict confidence. Such medical information shall only be required when the applicant is applying for the initial issuance of a special license plate or special certificate authorized under the provisions of § 27-15-308;
 - (5) Maintain accurate records of the annual number of special license plates and special certificates issued and in inventory; and
 - (6) Enter into the permanent record of each applicant the special license number, or special certificate number, and type of allowable disability of the applicant in a manner that will allow retrieval of the information for statistical use—; and
 - (7) Include a notice with all applications for a special license plate or special certificate informing the applicants and any other persons driving for the applicants of the requirements of this subchapter, and further

- specifically informing the applicants that the privilege to park in spaces
 reserved for persons with disabilities shall be available only when the person
- for whom the special plate or certificate was issued, or when a person with a disability is actually in the vehicle.

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- SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 27-15-308(c)(4), concerning special license plates and certificates for person with disabilities, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 (4) The special certificate shall be issued free of charge, and
 10 shall expire five (5) two (2) years from the last day of the month in which it
 11 is issued. Provided, however, the applicant shall not be required to obtain
 12 recertification of his qualifying disability in order to renew his special
 13 certificate.
- 14 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 27-15-308(c), concerning special license plates and 15 certificates for persons with disabilities, is amended to add an additional 16 subdivision to read as follows:
 - (5) (A) If a person to whom a special certificate or license plate has been issued moves to another state, the person shall surrender the special certificate or plate to the office.
 - (B) If a person to whom a special certificate or license plate has been issued dies, the special certificate or license plate shall be returned to the office within thirty (30) days after the death of the person to whom the special certificate or plate was issued.

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- SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 27-15-314 is amended to read as follows: 27-15-314. Parking spaces by private agencies.
- (a)(1) Any business firm or other person licensed to do business with the public or owning or operating a business which provides parking access to the public may provide specially designated and marked motor vehicle parking spaces for the exclusive use of people with disabilities who have been issued a special license plate or special certificate.
- (2) Private businesses which provide parking access intended for use by the public, which are constructed after January 1, 1992, and private businesses which undertake significant physical modifications or alterations of their premises after January 1, 1992, shall provide parking spaces in such number and otherwise in accordance with the standards set forth in § 27-15-313

1	for parking spaces for people with disabilities regulations promulgated by the
2	Department of Finance and Administration which would be consistent with Public
3	Law 100-641, and rules issued pursuant thereto by the United States Secretary
4	of Transportation.
5	(b) The minimum number of parking spaces shall comply with
6	the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act.
